Power grid collapses again, first in 2024

BUJA-National power grid yesterday collapsed again for the first time in 2024, though slow recovery began immediately.

The collapse, which occurred around 11 am, crashed power supplied through the grid to 59.90 Megawatts from 2,658MW

recorded an hour earlier.

The grid had only Ibom Power at 31MW and Azura IPP at 28MW as the only power plants with power.

It, however, began a slow recovery with data supplied by the Independent National System Operator showing that as at 5pm, power on the grid had risen to 525.7MW, with Azura rising to 353MW;

Egbin Power generating, 142MW; and Ibom Power at 30.7MW.

Earlier, the Abuja Electricity Distribution Company, AEDC, had informed its customers across the Federal Capital Territory, FCT, Kogi, Niger and Nasarawa states that the power outage was caused by the collapse of the

"Be rest assured that we are working with the relevant stakeholders to restore power as soon as the grid is stabilized. We appeal for your patience."

Meanwhile, concerned about low power supply affecting some parts of the country, the Minister of Power, Chief Adebayo Adelabu, weekend met with top management teams of power generating companies (GenCos) and distribution companies (DisCos) in a bid to find lasting solution to blackout in some parts of the country.

A statement by his media aide, Bola Tunji, yesterday said Chief Adelabu told Managing Directors and Chief Executive Officers of the companies at separate meeting in his office, that there was a noticeable improvement in power supply during the yuletide period but the situation changed in the New Year with poor supply leading to blackouts across the country

The Minister said his investigation revealed that the poor supply was due to low gas supply to GenCos.

"It was based on the need to understand the challenges first hand that led to inspection visits to power facilities in Olorunsogo in Ogun State and Omotosho in Ondo State. The problem is traceable to low supply of gas and we need to resolve this as quickly as possible", he said.

Tunji said the meeting also issues discussed indebtedness to GenCos by the Nigeria Bulk Electricity Trading Company, NBET.

'We are aware that the sector has liquidity challenges, but we need to have a minimum threshold, we are working on revalidating the debt and determining a fair resolution", he quoted the Minister to have said.

Brain drain: Over 500 workers left National Hospital in 2 years - CMD

ABUJA-More than 500 personnel of the National Hospital, Abuja, NHA, left its services in search of greener pastures in the last two years, its Chief Medical Director, Prof. Mahmud Raji, has disclosed.

Raji told the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) in Abuja yesterday that most of them went abroad in search of better

working conditions.

He said: "The way they leave is a very hurtful thing hospital administrators. The most pitiful and worrisome aspect of it is the amount of money

 $the\,Nigerian\,government\,has$ invested into each of these individuals, either a doctor, a nurse, a pharmacist, a physiotherapist or whoever it is that leaves.

He said the brain drain syndrome was an almost everyday activity as he treats two or three files of young people wishing to leave.

"Sometimes, not only young people; some people have actually gone through the ranks with lots of experience that they could teach other people. So, Nigeria is losing so much, painfully.

"Here, we have lost a number of quite senior doctors, especially the middle cadre doctors, and the very

'Nurses have also left from the middle cadre and the younger ones. Some of our medical engineers are hotcakes outside and have

"I must tell you, Nigeria trains people so much, Nigerian graduates and staff are well sought after, all over,' he added.

On reasons for their departure, he said remuneration and job satisfaction had always topped the list.
"For instance, if a doctor or

a nurse comes here, he or she needs to see an environment that is quite serene, quite beautiful, even to rest in a very comfortable area during their one hour break.

"At least, you are able to have something to eat, replenish your energy before you go back to the next phase of work, but usually, in our hospitals in Nigeria, we don't

"In terms of remuneration, it may not be as good as what you would expect elsewhere. Even though I must say the purchasing power in Nigeria is far better than the purchasing power elsewhere and our money is still able to buy something.

SHELL Petroleum Development Company of Nigeria Limited, SPDC, and its joint venture partners, the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited, Total Energies EP Nigeria Limited, and Nigerian Agip Oil Company, have taken the final investment decision, FID, to build a dedicated upstream facility to supply 100 million standard cubic feet of gas per day to Dangote Fertiliser and Petrochemical Plant in Lekki, Lagos State, for 10 years

Managing Director of SPDC, the operator of the joint venture, Osagie Okunbor, disclosed this in Port Harcourt weekend, describing the FID as a significant step in supporting the Nigerian government's "Decade of

Ğas'' ambition. He said: "This investment decision is a critical step in pursuing the development of the gas-rich Iseni field, which is part of the Okpokunou Cluster in Oil Mining Lease

35 located in Sagbama Local Government Area of Bayelsa State.

Okunbor said SPDC and its joint venture partners remained committed to Nigeria's 'Decade of Gas' ambition, particularly domestic gas agenda.

According to him, increasing the delivery of natural gas to the domestic market is key to accelerated industrialization and economic development in Nigeria.

The FID signals a positive step towards the construction of the required infrastructure for the project that is expected to create jobs through direct and indirect employment.

Dangote boasts Africa's largest granulated urea fertiliser complex and produces around 65 percent of Nigeria's domestic fertiliser requirements.

The project will supply gas which will enhance the Dangote Fertiliser and Petrochemical Plant's ability to deliver on its promise to the Nigerian people and government.



Huge sums recovered from Humanitarian ministry officials — *EFCC*

BUJA — ABUJA - III Financial Crimes Commission, EFCC, has recovered huge sums of Naira from various officials of the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Poverty Alleviation.

A competent source in the agency, disclosed this yesterday to **Vanguard**, said EFCC recovered N30 billion from immeidate past minister of the ministry, Sadiya Umar-Farouq and N17 billion from suspended minister of the ministry.

The source, who is familiar with the recoveries so far made, told our correspondent that the amount traced to top officials of the ministry was more than what was known in public space.

The competent source said that agency had so far recovered at least N30 billion out of the N37 billion said to have

been diverted under the immediate past minister, Sadiya Umar-Farouq.

The top source explained that the agency was able to recover the cash from accounts traced to the former minister by placing a lien on the identified accounts.

The source did not however, give the details of the cash recovered from her since she is still being probed by operatives.

'What we have done so far in respect of the money traced to senior elements in humanitarian affairs ministry shows that our investigation is going

the source said.

However, a source close to the suspended Vanguard yesterday that it was not true that N17 billion had been traced to the suspended minister.

The recovery comes in the wake of the success recorded by the EFCC under the new leadership of Ola Olukoyede.

Chairman of Emure Local Government Area of the state, Mr. Adebayo Oluwatosin, who confirmed this to newsmen in a telephone conversation, yesterday, said the driver of the school bus was killed while other eight regained their freedom

Oluwatosin did not disclose how the victims were rescued

Confirming the development, Ekiti State Police Command Public Relations Officer, Sunday Abutu said: "All victims were rescued today about 1:30a.m., but unfortunately, we lost the driver who was suspectedly killed by the abductors.'

During interrogation, a suspect named Babooga Alhaji admitted that he took part in the assassination of the two traditional rulers. He is currently giving credible information that will lead to the arrest of other gang leaders."

NDLEA intercepts 14.5 tons of Ghanaian Loud in Lagos and intercepted at Ojuelegba area

THE National Drug Law Enforcement Agency, NDLEA, said, yesterday, that its operatives successfully intercepted large consignment of Ghanaian Loud, a strong strain of cannabis sativa, smuggled into Lagos from Ghana, loaded in two trucks and a J5 bus with a total weight of 14, 524.8 kilograms.

NDLEA said the three vehicles conveying jumbo bags of the psychoactive substance were trailed

The agency in a statement said: "In the process of blocking the vehicles, two of the drivers jumped off on motion while the third driver. 66-year-old Nasiru Ojomu, who works with wanted Akala, Mushinbased drug baron, Suleiman Jimoh (alias Olowo Idi Ogede, also known as Temo) was arrested.

"In the last three years, NDLEA operatives have seized several shipments of same psychoactive

substance worth billions of naira linked to Temo. "The wanted drug lord has since

gone into hiding while the agency continues manhunt for him," it said in a statement.

The agency added that its operatives on routine patrol around a warehouse sealed on Church Street, Idumota, Lagos over an ongoing investigation on February 1, arrested three suspects, Joseph Joshua; Muhammed Adamu and Balarabe Musa.

The suspects burgled the store and

loaded 546,700 pills of tramadol and other opioids into a waiting vellow bus marked BDG 447 XD and an unregistered Suzuki minibus.

Meanwhile, a male deaf and dumb suspect dealing in illicit substances has been arrested at Samaru area of Zaria, Kaduna state.

At the time of his arrest, 150 grams of cannabis were recovered from him while selling the psychoactive substance.

Another suspect, Ibrahim Sani, 56, was also arrested in possession of 51 kilograms of same substance at Tirkaniya area of the state

THE continuous rise in the prices of goods and services have crawled into every sphere of the economy.

the living standards of some rich people have been cut down by the foreign exchange saga and other policy reforms, and those who are embarking on building projects are not left out.

Economy&Lifestyle discovered that one area where the economy slapped home owners is the increasing cost of screeding a building.

To screed your internal walls you need a mixture of screeding paint, bond and pop cement. For external walls you only need black cement and pop paint.

Screeding is a process of flattening and smoothing a surface. This method of prepping your walls prior to painting maximises your emulsion, oil, silk paint finishes.

Mr. Segun Aloma, a businessman, whose building is under construction, said that the high cost of building materials frustrated the work on his project, making him seek cheap and safe means to complete his building.

"My new house is undergoing screeding. It has two duplexes. A friend of mine sold the idea to

"Building materials are on the high side today. Cost of little materials like nails, wood, cement, strings have increased not to talk of sand, prices of blocks among other

"Before you could spend less than N200,000 in a building but now you have to have up to N500,000.

"The cost of screeding materials like pop cement, paint and bond have risen. Many Nigerians are skipping the procedure when constructing their houses

"I had to go for an artisan who makes local screeding materials to complete my building walls.

"I spent just N300,000 for both workmanship and screeding of two flats.

"On a normal basis, if I had allowed the use of ready made materials it would have cost me twice the amount.

"I urge the government to look

into the cost of imports of building materials to save us from continuous incidents of building colapse which leads to loss of lives and properties.'

The most available size of screeding paint in Nigeria market is that of 20 litres bucket which costs N14,000 above depending on the brand.

Further investigation revealed that the cost of white cement has risen from N6,000 to N19,000. The price of screeding paint increased to N25,000 from N14,000 and that of bond from N13,000 to N21,000 above.

Loko who is into building interior and exterior finishing and makes local screeding materials, said: "I make local screeding materials. The finished work looks exactly like a screeding done with imported materials.

"Many of the building walls I have worked on last longer than two years.

"I make the bond and paint mixing it with white cement to make it stronger and then I mix it with the normal cement to make it darker.

"I earn more from making the screeding materials and also applying the materials on buildings."



A parent, whose child is at Igbo Owu Senior Secondary School, Work Yard, near Majekodunmi Street, Mushin, lamented her ordeal

Speaking on the condition of anonymity, the parent said: "I am a petty trader who struggles to take care of mychildren. We all know what the situation in the country is now. The cost of living is high and business is not like it was before. The state government just introduced this levy for final-year students this year. They said people should show their tax clearance certificates or pay that levy.

"Itried as much as I could but could not make the deadline last week and

the school authorities told me that my child would not be registered for the examination. We appreciate the state government for helping parents pay the exam fee, but they should know that not all parents work in the formal sector where they can get a tax clearance certificate to show."

Servicing IMF loan that is allegedly missing, diverted or unaccounted for is double jeopardy for Nigerians—they can neither see nor benefit from the projects for which the loan was approved; yet, they are made to pay both the loan and accrued interests.

"Any failure to investigate these grave allegations, bring suspected perpetrators to justice and recover any missing IMF loan would have serious resource allocation and exacerbate the country's debt

"We would be grateful if the recommended measures are taken within seven days of the receipt and/ or publication of this letter. If we have not heard from you by then, SERAP shall consider appropriate legal actions to compel your government to comply with our request in the public interest.

"The allegations of corruption in the spending of IMF loan documented by the Auditor-General undermine economic development of the country, trap the majority of Nigerians in poverty and deprive them of opportunities.

"According to the 2020 annual audited report by the Auditor-General of the Federation published last week, the \$3.4 billion emergency financial assistance obtained from the International Monetary Fund, IMF, to finance the budget and manage the health crisis stemming from the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic may have been missing, diverted or unaccounted for.

The governor, who was represented by the Secretary to the State Government, SSG, and chairman of the committee, Prof. Chidiebere Onyia, said the terms of reference of the committee as spelt out should be implemented to the letter, adding that the procedures adopted must pass the tests of integrity, accountability, traceability, transparency, and fairness to all parties regardless of status.

The committee, known as Inter-Ministerial Committee Property/Land Reconciliation Compensation in Enugu State, is saddled with the responsibility of verifying all title documents relating to lands and property in any designated area assigned for construction; verifying all construction approvals and stages of construction.

It is also to reconcile all issues of double allocations, wrongful allocation, double certificates of occupancy; evaluation and payment of compensations in respect of any acquisition; resolving issues of acquisition and recommending amount of compensation to be paid, and verifying allocations and payment made as a result of the allocations.

World Cancer Day: Africa recorded 573, 653 deaths in 2022—WHO

S the world yesterday As the world yester —, marks this year's World Cancer Day, the World Health Organization, WHO, has raised alarm over what it described as a 'disheartening' situation of cancer in Africa, disclosing that approximately 882 new cancer cases occurred in the WHO African region, with around 573, 653 deaths in 2022.

political officeholders in Africa to go the extra mile to ensure a cancer-free Africa, warned that if urgent measures were not taken, cancer mortality in the region was projected to reach about one million deaths per year by 2030.

Also, in 20 years, cancer death rates in Africa will overtake the global average

of 30 per cent. This is more so because cancer survival rates in the WHO African region currently average 12 per cent much lower than the average of over 80 per cent in High-Income Countries.

"Nevertheless, we commend the progress made in cancer prevention and care in our region. For instance, 17 countries have introduced high-performance-based screening tests in line with WHO's recommendations.

"Also, 28 of our member states have introduced nationwide HPV vaccination to reach about 60 per cent of the priority population targeted with vaccination," she explained.

She said this year's theme was auspicious as it reinforced all persons and groups' universal right to health.

Moeti said regardless of socioeconomic geographic location, age, and gender, every person must be afforded an equal chance at the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of cancer. "She called on the region's countries, communities, partners, and civil society to unite and foster universal access to cancer prevention and care.

Rivers LP guber candidate, Itubo, dismisses alleged bribe by Wike over S'Court case

Itubo said: "I consulted our stakeholders before I moved to withdraw the matter from the court. However, we consulted from down to up. We saw that we need to sheath our sword. There is a time to fight and there is a time to stop fighting. I was aggrieved because I was robbed and needed to reclaim my mandate that was the reason I went to court.

"I needed to correct this impression and wrong information: former Governor Wike did not bribe me to go to the Supreme Court against Fubara. It was all falsehood."

BENIN CITY—DESPITE protest in some quarters, including nine of its aspirants, the Peoples Democratic Party, PDP, yesterday, conducted its delegates congress to elect three people from the ward that would participate in the February 22 governorship primary.

The exercise went ahead despite the stepping down of the chairman of the threeman committee headed by Governor Seyi Makinde of Oyo State, as Governor Peter Mbah of Enugu State, who is said to be the deputy chairman was present in the state to conduct the primary, where he commended the large turnout of members of the party.

Speaking to party faithful at the George Idah Primary School, Benin City, which is the Collation Centre for Ward 2, Mbah said: "This is democracy where our people come to exercise their franchise, we appreciate this turnout. Our party is known for its principles, which is fairness, equity and justice. I wish you all conduct yourselves properly as we hold this election."

In Ward 7 at Ugbekun Primary School in Ikpoba-Okha LGA of the state, Dr. Major Itemowe led others to conduct the exercise while in Oluku Ward, Kunle Koya from Lagos State conducted the exercise.

Speaking to journalists in his Ward 4 Collation Centre, Idia College, Governor Godwin Obaseki said the crisis in the party was being overhyped and that it would not affect the outcome of the governorship election.

According to him, "You

can see from the crowd here that it is a lot of success, a huge turn out. We had over 600 people coming out to participate here. Our people are very politically aware. We are happy with this turn out to elect delegates for our gubernatorial primary and we are also expecting this huge turnout in the main election."

On the withdrawal of Makinde, Obaseki said: "It is unfortunate that Makinde withdrew. There are three governors and he is only one of the three. So withdrawing does not really remove the credibility of the process and it is not just the process and what makes a process credible is the quality of the participation and you can see for yourself.

"So, it is unfortunate that Governor Makinde had to take such decision but I hope that all our efforts to continue to unify the party and pacify all players will continue. We are not deterred at all, we are going to make sure that PDP plays its role in the politics of this country."

On non participation of members of the Legacy Coalition of the PDP, he said: "You cannot have a 100 percent, clearly you can see the crowd here. When we

were in APC before we joined the PDP, we didn't have these numbers, so clearly the people we met in the party are still in the party.

"The crisis is hyped, it is not as fundamental as it is made to look on ground. There is very little crisis, the crisis is fanned from outside and our people are smarter than that. You will see during the main election, we are not going to allow ourselves to be sold."

9 aspirants protest

The nine aspirants in their letter to acting National Chairman and copied the National Vice Chairman South-South of the party, Dan Orbih, protested the process and compositions of those to conduct the delegates election.

The petition by Philip Shaibu, Omoregie Ogbeide-Ihama, Anselm Ojezua, Felix Akhabue, Amb. Martin Uhomoibhi, Hafia Hadizat Umoru, Omosede Igbinedion, Dr. Earl Onaiwu and Arthur Esene read: "We have also seen two lists of the composition of the Edo State three Ad-Hoc Ward Congresses Electoral Committee and two lists of the Ward Congress Electoral Officers and a list of LGA Monitoring Officers

"With regard to the notice to INEC, we humbly observe that it lacks legitimacy because it was signed by an acting National Secretary, when we have a substantive National Secretary in office. This falls short of the statutory requirement contained in the Electoral Act.

"Furthermore, we are confronted by two lists of the Edo State 3 Ad-Hoc Ward Congresses Electoral Committee. The only similarity between them is that the Chairman is Seyi Makinde, the composition is different. We do not know which one is the authentic one duly approved by the National Working Committee."

Delta govt distributes 388 tonnes of maize to poultry farmers

WARRI— YOUTH leaders and stakeholders of other ethnic nationalities in Niger Delta have asked the Ijaw ethnic nationality to stop what they termed its entitlement mentality to the leadership of the Presidential Amnesty Programme, PAP, initiated by the Federal Government in 2009.

The Ijaw Youth Council, IYC, Worldwide, had, last month, warned the Federal Government against appointing a non-Ijaw as the Coordinator of PAP

Coordinator of Gas Pipeline Host Communities, Akwa Ibom State, Kufre Emmanson, said: "I do not think PAP is for the Ijaws only and none Niger Delta at large. We disagree that it must be Ijaw only to be appointed to pilot affairs of the Amnesty Programme.

"Other tribes in the Niger Delta have as much right to occupy that position. The Ijaw can only control its area. In Akwa Ibom, the Ibibio and Annang are not Ijaw. The PAP is a programme for youths of Niger Delta and not Ijaw youths alone.

An ex-militant leader and president of the Abuja chapter of the Urhobo Youth Council, self-styled "General" Peter Aghogho

said: "There are other ethnic nationalities, which are beneficiaries of PAP. The other ethnic nationality also surrendered their arms just as the Ijaw did, so it is an aberration for the Ijaw to have an entitlement mentality over the leadership of the Presidential Amnesty Programme.

Secretary of Ndokwa National Youth Movement, NNYM, Presley Idi, said: "We wish to state in clear terms that the office of the PAP coordinator is not in any way an exclusive right of the Ijaw ethnic nationality.

"From the inception of the programme till now, only those from the Ijaw stock have been considered to coordinate the programme and this in any way does not seem fair and equitable."

National President, Urhobo Progress Union, UPU, Youth Wing worldwide (Ukoko Re' Ighele Urhobo), Blessed Ughere, said: "We are equal stake in the Niger Delta struggle. With careful calculation, the Urhobos have been the ones that have programme to make sure the programme runs smoothly but have not benefited from the programme.

Immediate past President of the Isoko National Youth Assembly, INYA, Amos Etaluku said: "Since the PAP was established, the Isoko have not had their fair share.

"The Jjawhave constantly been appointed as coordinators. I think the entire people of the Niger Delta are brothers, and I do not think it is wrong for the appointment to be given to an Isoko person."

Absence of good governance hurting Africa's devt— Ezekwesili

THE Founder, School of Politics, Policy and Governance and Chair, Governance and #FixPolitics, Dr Obiageli Ezekwesili, has linked Africa's under-development to the $absence \, of good \, governance \, and \,$ quality political leadership.

She spoke at the inaugural session of the SPPG Distinguished Guest Speaker Series, weekend, which was attended by thousands of Africans and global stakeholders.

Speaking on the theme, 'Power, Performance and Legitimacy: Renewing Global Democratic Momentum,' she explained that the central thesis of #FixPolitics research was that "the absence of good governance is the greatest obstacle" to Nigeria's economic development.

Ezekwesili told participants: "The failure of the country's variant of politics and public leadership inherently subverts public good and places their personal and narrow interests above the collective

wellbeing of citizens. "In the light of the above, whether it is 2020 or 2060, nothing about Nigeria can change without transformation of its politics. Our democracy is coming out of deficit, as African politicians have not delivered on the contract between them and the people they govern.'

Explaining how nations grow, Ezekwesili said the trinity of growth and development showed that citizens of Nigeria and the rest of Africa need a politics that leads to good governance.

According to her, sound policies, strong institutions and efficient priority of investment in public goods and services are crucial for private sector

emergence and growth of the

Ezekwesili called for the establishment of unconventional SPPG to flood the political space with a new class of valued-based politicians that would emerge on

a large scale. On his part, Prof Larry Diamond from Stanford University, United States of America, condemned the practice where the ruling party controls the political pace, electoral process and makes credible elections impossible.

Diamond, a senior fellowat the Hoover Institution and the Mosbacher Senior Fellow in Global Democracy at the Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies at Stanford University, said, "Nigeria has a lot of traditional rulers, who are preservers of culture and key in maintaining peace."

Expert speaks on tax **implications** for fintech, other financial institutions

A^N accounting and tax management expert, Titilayo Akinseye, has said the tax implications of revenuesharing arrangements between fintech companies and traditional financial institutions in Nigeria are complex and require careful consideration.

She made this known in a briefing, stating that these arrangements often involve the sharing of revenues from joint ventures, partnerships, or shared

Akinseye explained that these collaborations, manifesting as joint ventures, partnerships or shared services, present a labyrinth of tax considerations. These include income taxation, withholding tax, transfer pricing, VAT implications and the necessity for meticulous documentation and compliance.

"Income tax liabilities are a primary concern in these arrangements. Each entity is required to report its revenue share as part of its taxable income. Ensuring proper documentation and adherence to withholding tax obligations is paramount to circumvent penalties and disputes," Akinseye emphasised.



723 schools closed in 9 states over insecurity, others —UNICEF (September 2023) the states taken over two schools in

AKURDI—NO M AKUKDI-110 fewer than 723 schools have reportedly been closed down in nine states across the country, due to insecurity and occupation of the school premises by state

and non-state actors, Internally Displaced Persons, IDPs, including incidents of flood, leading to obstruction of teaching and learning in the affected schools.

According to the United Nations Children's Fund. UNICEF, Safe School Data, affected include Adamawa. Benue, Borno, Imo, Katsina, Kebbi, Sokoto, Yobe and Zamfara.

A breakdown of the data indicated that 26 schools were closed in Adamawa State, Benue had 28 of its schools closed, Borno 72 schools, Imo 62 schools, Katsina 61 schools, Kebbi 68

schools, Sokoto 115 schools, Yobe 15 schools and Zamfara 276 schools.

The data further indicated that State actors occupied seven schools in Adamawa State, 11 were occupied in Benue, 36 in Borno, one in Imo, seven in Katsina, one in Yobe and 22 in Zamfara state.

Meanwhile non-state actors were reported to have Borno State, 45 in Imo and 134 Zamfara states. The data also showed that

nine schools were closed down due to incidents of flood in Adamawa State, 19 in Borno, 16 in Imo, 54 in Katsina, 24 in Kebbi, 109 in Sokoto, 14 in Yobe and 58 in Zamfara

Also, six states of Adamawa, Benue, Borno, Kebbi, Sokoto, and Zamfara had 154 of their schools occupied by Internally Displaced Persons, IDPs.

According to the data, the number of IDPs that occupied schools in Adamawa stood at 10, Benue 17, Borno 15, Kebbi 44, Sokoto six, and Zamfara 62.

Speaking on the importance of education to the child, the Communication Officer, UNICEF, Enugu Fleld Office, Dr. Officer, Ijeoma Onuoha-Ogwe said "education is a right of every child, it should not just happen to a child in Nigeria as a chance but a right."

Be proactive on girl-child education

A D U N A — N A T I O N A L Association of Seadogs, NAS, former lawmaker, Senator Shehu Sani, monarchs from the North and other stakeholders have identified the girl-child education as a critical social issue in the North, which needs urgent government attention.

 $The\, stakeholders, who\, were$ in Kaduna at the 15th Ralph Okpara Memorial Lecture, organised by the National Association of Seadogs-Pyrates Confraternity, NAS/ PC, said, at the Arewa House, that now is the time for policy makers to be brought before the table to identify what the issues were, with a view to take necessary action about the girl-child.

The NAS International leader, Abiola Owoaje, told journalists that "we are here to highlight the challenges of the girl.child particularly as they relate to education.

He said time to time they carried out such advocacy works to let the government know about areas where intervention was needed.

Dr Obinna Okpara, the leader of Seadogs Kaduna Chapter, said they were equipping schools to encourage general learning in the state, and they were already building a toilet facility in a Kaduna hospital, and were prepared to see how they could visit correctional facilities so as to assist in setting free inmates who committed lesser crimes but couldn't be able to pay fine.

"These are inmates whose fine is 50, 20 or 10 thousand, who did not commit kidnapping or robbery. So we are looking at releasing 50 to hundred, which is going to be achieved legally," he said.

NSITF: Employers' contribution, not govt

revenue —NECA

ABUJA—THE Nigeria Employers Consultative Association, NECA, has said the contribution by the employers to the Nigeria Social Insurance Trust Fund, NSITF, is not revenue to the government, coming from the fund for the innovative measures it has taken to reposition the tripartite agency.

The Director General of NECA, Adewale-Smatt Oyerinde, spoke while on a working visit, over the weekend

A statement by NSITF, General Manager, Corporate Affairs, Nwachukwu Godson, explained that NECA, alongside the Organized Labour and Government constitute the tripartite ownership of the NSITF.

According to the statement, Oyerinde who appreciated the critical role the NSITF plays in stabilizing the world of work, pledged the continued support of the Organised Private Sector, OPS, to the fund as a social partner despite the turns in the national economy.

He said, "We have noted the many innovations that you brought in during this one year, and from far within our space, we have also noticed how much stability you have brought to

"We have also noted the direction that the fund seems to have now; especially the openness to engage because I know your Executive Director, Operations has been in Lagos

twice. To us, this openness to engage has endeared the fund the most, so kudos to the fund and its leadership.

"One of the things we strongly believe in is responsible enterprises, an employer that is responsible to its internal and external stakeholders - internal stakeholders – its employees within the context of salary payment, welfare issues, an employer that is responsible to its community and how much it can do within the context of corporate

responsibilities, an employer that is responsible to the government within the context of paying the taxes and so many other contributions."

On the new Federal Government policy on 50 per cent deduction of Gross Inflow under the Fiscal Responsibility Act and the listing of the NSITF among the agencies affected by the deduction of internally generated revenue, Oyerinde explained that "NECA is of the strong view that the contributions by the employers to the NSITF is not revenue to the government.

"It is absolutely not revenue to the government. It is meant for a purpose, and the purpose for which it is meant will be compromised if that policy goes through. So, we have also started our own advocacy at the back end. In fact, we had a meeting with the Security and Exchange Commission, SEC, last week because it also affected them. Our advocacy is already in place, and we will continue to engage

"We have started doing that. In fact, when this visit was scheduled, we wanted to also get your perspective so that we could input your own perspective into ours and then make public our definitive views. We intend to bring organized labour into the issue because business is an entity that doesn't have blood running through its veins. It is people. It is the people who are susceptible to injuries and accidents, and those people are primarily members of organized labour. Our belief also is that the organized labour will not fold their hands

or play the ostrich and believe this doesn't involve them because, in the long run, it is the members of labour, the workers that will be affected.

"So we are also bringing them on board in our advocacy. In the next two, or three days we will be writing to the Minister of Finance to let him know the critical stakeholders of the fund are in alignment that contributions from employers to the NSITF are not revenue

Your Excellency, the call by the NDFTJ for you to revoke, terminate, or sack Mrs. Oritsemeyiwa Eyesan over a purported influence in the process of reaward of pipeline surveillance contract to Pipeline Infrastructure Nigeria Limited (PINL) whom they claimed is owned by the Olu of Warri His Majesty Ogiame Atuwatse III, CFR is not only false but a calculated attempt to drag the name of our Revered Monarch and Father into the mud to satisfy an envious neighbour whose penchant for violence, lawlessness, criminality, greed, and clandestine activities against the Nigerian State and especially the Itsekiri People have been known for at least about a century.

HISTORY OF PIPELINE SURVEILLANCE DURING THE FOURTH REPUBLIC

During the President Muhammadu Buhari regime, the pipeline surveillance contract was awarded under an Ijaw man Timipre Silver as Minister of Petroleum Resources, and another Ijaw man Adokiye Tombomieye as Executive Vice President Upstream to few companies including at least two companies owned by Ijaw men but nobody including the president of NDFTJ accused either the Minister of Petroleum or the EVP UPSTREAM then as being corrupt or being ethnic biased probably since it involves Ijaw people. This is not to make any aspersions that the award of the contract was skewed to favour any ethnic Nationality or the Ijaw ethnic Nationality in particular.

Today, the president of NDFTJ has suddenly woken up from his deep slumber to call for the sack of our Mother and Daughter who has been an astute professional, and arguably the best ever career woman in Nigeria for the last decade in a career spanning over 30 years in both private and public circles.




OUR DEMANDS

The stuff that makes Isaac's stars great are not in the craftsmanship expended on them, but in the philosophy the stars expound, the idea and the phenomena they represent.

Our world today is choked up by u n n e c e s s a r y competition: writing competition, music competition, sports competition, dancing competition, cooking competition, reading competition, spelling competition, essay competition, etc.

In all aspects of our are in lives. we competition with one another. Among ourselves, we want to know who has more money, whose house is bigger and more beautiful, who is more intelligent, who is the best student, who is the best pupil, who is more popular, who has achieved more in life, etc. The competition is endless.

But Isaac's stars are helping us to understand that in destiny, there shouldn't be any competition. As a matter of fact, everyone who was alive was a star, just as everyone who is alive today is a star. As entities, we emit energies. But we are irregular stars, according to Isaac.

While the lights of some stars are bright, some are less bright. Some are dim. Some are even black! And it is alright and all well for the stars to be different and diverse in diverse ways. Diversity, after all, is not just the beauty of nature, but sustenance.

Diversity is one of the reasons extinction hasn't brought life as we know

it on earth to an end. After dinosaurs died off, for instance, crocodiles survived. Imagine what would have happened if all the animals on earth were dinosaurs.

Isaac Emokpae's stars have revolutionalized the way we see ourselves. "My Nigerian Stars" is helping us to critically examine how we view our identities and our places in the world. In the work which is in series, Emokpae did not forget some stars that are missing, dimmed, bloody or broken.

"The stars irregular. That is to show that no one is perfect," Isaac said. "Some people may not get a 100 per cent score, but the truth is they are getting better at what they are doing."

For the missing stars, Isaac says it represents an absence. "We have people who can choose to be better, but choose not And be." to sometimes, he says, some stars that had been shining

missing and suddenly the society has lost a star. The artist creatively captures the disparity between each star in the work.

Review of Evolution and Revolution of Takaful in West Africa and Beyond

Tntroduction: In the $oldsymbol{oldsymbol{L}}$ elementary study of insurance, we were taught that conventional insurance is different from wagering for various reasons among which was absence of uncertainty.

The critical minded students then knew this was not true, and on the part of the insuring public – to show their disbelief too, they

would ask insurance marketer supposing the loss did not happen what happens to the premium they have paid. Majority of us here know the answer to that query. It is this element of quasiuncertainty in the insurance contract that adherents of Islam frown at, hence they prefer not to buy insurance products from the conventional

In order to bring this set of people to the good family of risk protections Africa through Sudan,

as South Africa did with Critical Illness Insurance, gave the world Takaful insurance. The essence of this Sudanese gift is that majority of Moslems who would not have insured their risks as a result of their religious belief will now have a vehicle to do so.

What then do we mean by Takaful insurance? To me, Takaful insurance is a form of insurance that took its root from the mutual that

developed during the industrial revolution whereby the policyholders are not only the owners of the insurance company but also share in the fortunes of their insurance

This is the reason insurance students were taught that mutual companies are owned by the policyholders. Another quality that made Takaful to be different from mutual insurance is its being Shariah

compliant. I may not be that right hence I will like to see the views of Islamic financially experts on the subject. In this light, Prof Abdel-Rahman Yousri (2009) had argued that Takaful insurance should be perceived as co-operative and mutual insurance. He further posited that it must be Shariah compliant hence Shariah is the religious law of Islam.

This by implication means that if it is not Shariah complaint, it should not be permissible for Moslem adherents. Similarly, Mohd Fadzli Yusof, et al (2015) revealed that in the field of finance, Moslems have been called upon to create institutions that can provide services free of un-Islamic elements like interest (riba), uncertainty, unfairness and imbalance or injustice.

These scholars agreed that Takaful insurance has been adopted worldwide as the generic name for Islamic insurance, following a proposal from Malaysia at the summit of heads of state of the eight (D8) development Islamic countries in Dhaka juncture, it is important to note that the first Takaful Company to be incorporated, which was known as Islamic Insurance Company Limited, was established in Sudan in 1979. The first Retakaful was established in Saudi Arabia (although it was a combination of Takaful and Retakaful, the real Retakaful company was first established in Malaysia). There is process in place to establish Retrotakaful in line with the Retrocessionnaires in the conventional insurance markets among other developments in the Takaful insurance model.

Furore over 14 years unpaid salaries, gratuities of ex-Premier Breweries staff

ONITSHA— Backlog of unpaid salaries and gratuities among other benefits to no fewer than 4,000 former workers of Premier Breweries PLC, Ontsha, Anambra State, have been causing uproar in the state 14 years after they were disengaged.

The aggrieved ex-staff of once adjudged the second largest brewing company in the country and a public liability company based in Onitsha, Anambra State which specialized in brewing the famous Premier lager beer, have the State pleaded with Ānambra Government to intervene and save them from untimely death.

The company, which Anambra State government is a shareholder had allegedly disengaged all its staff in 2000 without paying their backlog of salaries and gratuities.

Some of the disengaged staff who lamented their ordeal, included Wilson Iweka, Clement Ike, Prince Godfrey Nwakobi, Michael Alaefuna, among others.

72-year- old Clement Ike who claimed to have joined Premier Breweries as a Senior Supervisor from Golden Guinea Breweries, Umuahia, Abia State, said he was among those disengaged by Premier Breweries in 2000 without pay.

Wilson Iweka, who worked in the Production

Department as Bottle Attendant from 1980 to 1996 and retired with a long service award, said life had not been easy for him since then.

According to him, if not that he joined a community vigilante services, he would have seen hell in this his old age.

Prince Nwakobi who also retired as a Senior Supervisor, said: "Premier Breweries closed operations in the year 2000 without paying any of us any dime. Production

resumed few yerars after and it is currently producing table water but not yet beer. We are therefore pleading with the state government which has shares in the company to come to our rescue by paying us our outstanding salaries and other entitlements."

However, reacting, the Company's Legal Adviser, Tony Orunkoya, said some time in 2003, the company appointed a Receiver Manager who tabulated all the dues owed to all the retirees and settled them whole

and entire.

Orunkoya who also doubles as company's secretary, intended that any retiree who clams that he is still being owed, should be asked to produce his or her letter of engagement and letter of disengagement from the company, to prove his or her point.

A former Managing Director of the company, Prof. Nnamdi Chukwura confirmed that he was sacked from the board without pay.

Gratuity: Gov Lawal approves payment of N4bn to Zamfara teachers, LG workers **exercise.**

GOVERNOR Dauda Lawal of Zamfara State has approved the payment of over N4 billion outstanding gratuities for Local Government workers and primary school teachers.

The Permanent Secretary, Ministry for Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs, Abubakar Chika, disclosed this in Gusau after defending the 2024 budget proposal for the 14 Local Government Areas, LGAs, at the House of Assembly.

Chika said that the State Government had already set up committees for the verification of local government workers and retired primary school teachers from 2012 to date

"The committee has already commenced the verification, very soon we will commence the payment.

"Possibly by

"Possibly by tommorow, Friday, or next week Monday we will begin the payment of verified beneficiaries.

"Since inception, the present administration under Governor Lawal has been making arrangements to increase the salary of local government workers and primary teachers in the state," Chika said.

Earlier, the Chairman, House Committee on Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs, Hamisu Faru, commended the 14 LGAs for their compliance with the assembly's rules and regulations during the

Faru urged the council chairmen to intensify efforts to improve the Internally Generated Revenue, IGR, of their councils.

"Each of the 14 LGAs must initiate ways to enhance their IGR to enable government to execute development projects, especially in rural communities.

"The seventh assembly in the state is committed to ensuring better revenue generation and remittance and since our inception we have reviewed laws in line with the modern system of revenue generation.

"This exercise is part of the assembly's efforts to enhance IGR of the state, in line with the governor's rescue mission's policies and programmes," Faru said

PTAD opens up on alleged payment of N900m into private accounts

THE Pension Transitional A r r a n g e m e n t Directorate, PTAD, has dismissed report claiming it paid over N900million into private accounts in three months, describing the report as malicious, reeks of mischief and a blatant misrepresentation of facts.

Reacting to a report credited to an online medium, PTAD in a statement by its Head, Corporate Communications, Gbenga Ajayi, among others, said "The attention of the PTAD has been drawn to an online feature by the Foundation Investigative Journalism, FIJ, on January 28th, 2024 caption "EXPOSED: FG PAYS OVER N900 MILLION INTO
ACCOUNTS IN
3MONTHS". Under the
"MORE THAN N3ŎO MILLION PAID INTO PRIVATE ACCOUNTS OCTOBER" wherein FIJ stated "different private individuals were the beneficiaries of these

payments."

"We want to state categorically that the report is malicious, reeks of mischief and a blatant misrepresentation of facts.

"For the record, PTAD, as a wholly treasury-funded agency, pays over Nine Billion Naira (N9billion) monthly into the individual pension accounts of about two hundred and twenty (220,000)thousand pensioners of the Federal Civil Service, Police, Customs, Immigration and Correctional Services, and Treasury-Funded Parastatals as pension, and has continued to make sure that every pensioner receives his or her pension entitlements, like unpaid arrears, subject to the validation of claims and availability of funds from the Federal Government.

"It should also be clearly noted that PTAD pays pension entitlements into individual pensioners' accounts, and not corporate accounts or joint accounts, in line with extant pension laws. The private individual accounts listed in the FIJ feature do not belong to PTAD staff or any Government Official, but belong to verified pensioners from the Civil Service and Parastatals Pension Departments on PTAD database who after verification and revalidation of the validation pensioners' career documents were paid their pension arrears for the period owed.

"Mr Hyginus Ogbonnaya Olumba, a verified Civil Service Pension Department, CSPD, Pensioner currently receiving monthly pension was paid N5,104,375.10 as accumulated pension arrears covering from 2007 till 2023.

Similarly, Mr. Osinowo Adekunle Olugbenro and Mrs Juliana Okwuchi Agbasiere both verified Parastatals Pension Department (PaPD) currently Pensioners monthly receiving were pensions paid N5,135,442.58 and N6,031,907.68 respectively as accumulated pension arrears covering from 2020 till 2023.

"Between the months of September and October 2023, PTAD paid N846.1million and N1billion in accrued arrears to some pensioners of the Civil Service and Parastatals Pension Departments respectively. This information can readily be found on PTAD website and various news platforms.

"However, in line with the security, data and privacy protection, PTAD does not publish private details of our pensioners or of monthly pension or accumulated pension payments made to pensioners.

"It is indeed obvious from the details provided in this feature, that the information published by Foundation for Investigative Journalism (FIJ) is grossly misleading, malicious, misrepresentation of facts. It is indeed unfortunate that the online journal did not make any effort to get the opinion of PTAD in consonance with the tenets of balanced and fair reporting that journalism entails. In their bid to be sensational, they have only succeeded in putting the security and lives of aged pensioners at

"We would like to enjoin all Pensioners, the Pensioners' Union and all other related stakeholders, including the media, to continue to work with the Directorate towards ensuring that the Defined Benefit Pension Scheme of the Federal Government continues to benefit all eligible pensioners in a fair and equitable manner as envisioned by the founding fathers that initiated the reforms of the Pension Sector that led to the establishment of PTAD and brought in the positive changes and outcomes that have been achieved over the last ten years."

Thou shall not steal, especially if you are Methodist

Igrew up amongst Methodists and was taught by some of their best like Reverend J Obaba. Methodist Presbyter Samuel Adeoye Osinulu who was Principal of the Methodist Boys High School, MBHS, Lagos from 1955 to 1966, influenced generations of youths. These included the founding Governor of Lagos State, Brigadier General Mobolaji Johnson; his successor, Naval Admiral Adekunle Shamusideen Lawal; former Ogun State Governor, Segun Osoba; ex-Chief of Air Staff, Air Vice Marshal Nuraini Yusuf; and former National Planning Minister, Chief Rasheed Gbadamosi who actually lived in his house as a boarder.

The MBHS had also produced the founding President of Nigeria, Dr. Nnamdi Azikiwe and his fellow nationalist, Chief Hezekiah Oladipo Davis.

Indeed, the Methodists in Nigeria are some of the best Christians on earth. However, the main problem is that for decades, a land-grabbing syndicate which prices earthly things far above heavenly gains, has entrenched itself in the Methodist Church Nigeria, MCN.

This cartel, has an incredibly insatiable appetite for church and school property. In Lagos alone, they have swallowed the lands of the Methodist Primary School, Yaba. They fell on the lands of the Methodist Girls High School, Yaba, Lagos. Only the resistance of the Old Girls has saved the school's sports field. The cabal has also run the Wes-

ley University, Ondo, aground.

After the Tinubu administration in Lagos returned schools to the missions and former private proprietors, the cartel immediately seized the old MBHS school premises on 11, Broad Street, Lagos and swallowed it.

It was while digesting this, the cabal in 2012 first invaded the MBHS school lands at its new site on 11, Sinari Daranijo Street, Victoria Island wanting to build high-rise private luxury flats for sale to the public.

In the last dozen years, this is the Third Missionary Journey of the MBHS Old Boys after receiving SOS calls from the school, to 'Come over to Macedonia' and rescue it from the Church cabal. The battles to save the school lands have been waged each time a Prelate of the MCN is leaving or a new one comes into office.

Let me give a background. Methodist missionaries established the MBHS in 1878. I was privileged to be a student and Prefect when the school marked its centenary.

The first battles were in 2012 when Prelate Sunday Ola Makinde was about departing. The church administration, saying it wanted to raise funds, moved into the school premises to build private flats.

premises to build private flats.

However, the Old Boys led by Mr Toyin Amusan, blocked the move. A peace meeting held on July 11, 2012 with a 17-Member MCN delegation led by Prelate Makinde, agreed to leave the school lands which by then, had been reduced by land grabbers from 5.7 to 3.3 hectares.

The second attempt was in 2021 under Prelate Samuel Chukwuemeka Kalu Uche. This attempt was again resisted by the Old Boys. The MCN led by the Prelate and the Old Boys led by Mr Kolapo Sogbetun, held peace meetings on November 2 and 9, 2021 to resolve the stalemate. Prelate Uche ordered the church and its agents never to touch the school lands again. He however, made two requests of the Old Boys. First, that they should refund the N30 million the Church had spent on construction, and secondly, provide an alternative land for the MCN business ventures. Three days later, the Old Boys formally wrote the church, accepting both requests and also offering to contribute in building the new church business premises. However, the MCN in its November 18, 2021 letter signed by its Secretary, Rt Reverend Michael. O. Akinwale said the Prelate made a mistake in requesting for N30 million and that the actual compensation it wants the Old Boys to pay it is N390 million. But the Old Boys stuck to the

initial agreement.

The on-going third stage battles began in 2023 after Prelate Oliver Ali Aba took over the MCN mantle. Compared to his predecessors, Reverend Aba has been the most tactical, brazen and audacious. When his agents who invaded the school lands were evicted in August 2023, he made a tactical withdrawal and then on Monday, January 29, 2024, the MCN cabal returned in full force complete with over five dozen armed thugs who physically attacked the unarmed Old Boys led by 81-year-old Chief Tunde Fanimokun and 85-year-old Reverend Peter Omole.

When I watched the videos of the attacks, they reminded me of the heartless attacks by armed bandits of the Idoma villages which produced Prelate Aba.

This was a vain attempt to override the subsisting C of O in the name of MBHS, signed by Governor Lateef Jakande on October 25, 1983

Thirdly, it was the Registered Trustees of the MCN which on July 20, 2012 incorporated the J. Wesley Investment Company limited with N10 million shares. The 14 shareholders who are the Trustees themselves, include then Prelate Sunday Makinde with N3.5 million shares, and his predecessor, Dr Sunday Coffie Mbang with N500,000 shares. Then, the same MCN Trustees on November 11, 2016, illegally, sold 8,235.744 square metres of the MBHS school land to their private company for the princely sum of N1 million.

Fourthly, it is the MCN Trustees and their private J Wesley company that are using the school lands as collateral. Fifthly, it is the twosome that are building commercial flats in violation of the C of O that specifically states that the lands are for educational purposes only.

The truth stands naked; however, the current leaders of the MCN are desperate to robe it in priestly attires. The little veiled aim of the cabal is to relocate the MBHS and take over its entire lands.

THE impeachment of Olakunle Oluomo as Speaker of the Ogun State House of Assembly came at an unexpected time. After escaping the banana peels many times, he was ousted cheaply at an unprecedented time in the state's history. The development was coming just around when the Supreme Court put a rest to post-election litigation concerning the governorship election in the state.

Delivering the judgement, the five-member jury, led by Justice John Okoro, declared a watershed judgement upholding the election of Prince Dapo Abiodun as the duly elected Governor of Ogun State in the March 18, 2023 governorship election. Prince Abiodun's challenger and the PDP governorship candidate, Ladi Adebutu, failed to prove allegations of non-compliance with the Electoral Act during the conduct of the governorship election. "This appeal is unmeritorious and ought to be dismissed and it is hereby dismissed. The judgement of the court is hereby affirmed," Tijjani Abubakar, who read the lead judgement, said.

Governor Abiodun, who was seeking reelection, flew the flag of the APC during the March 18 governorship and was declared the winner by the Independent National Electoral Commission, INEC, having polled 276,298 votes to defeat Adebutu, who scored 262,383 votes.

As is his right, Adebutu approached the Ogun State Governorship Election Petitions Tribunal sitting in Abeokuta to contest the results of the election. In a unanimous ruling on Saturday, September 30, 2023, the threemember tribunal led by Justice Hamidu Kunaza struck out the

petition because it was "incompetent, defective, disjunctive and lack

Not satisfied with the judgement of the tribunal, and despite other opposition parties under the aegis of the Inter-Party Advisory Council, IPAC, in the state saying the case was dead on arrival at the higher courts, Adebutu proceeded to the Court of Appeal to challenge the

Addressing a press conference in Abeokuta after the tribunal judgement, IPAC's state chairman, Samson Okusanya described the statement credited to PDP after the judgement, which discredited the verdict, as docile and out of crass ignorance from political merchants

"Ladi Adebutu and his team of lawyers ought to have known that law and facts are not based on technicalities but rather on fairness and objectivity of the legal process which stipulates that the petitioner ought to have frontloaded certain information in the petition. We salute the judiciary and most im portantly members of the Tribunal led by Justice Hamidu Kunaza for a job well done. The PDP and her candidate should as a matter of importance, discontinue his planned wild goose chase at the appellate Court and accept the will of God," he said.

As predicted, Prince Abiodun's lawyer, Chief Wole Olanipekun (SAN), prayed the appellate court to dismiss the appeal. He urged the court to uphold Governor Abiodun's victory as the validly elected governor of Ogun State. The court upheld the prayer. Delivering judgement on the appeal, in its majority judgement of the threemember panel that was delivered by Justice Joseph Ikyegh, said there was no reason to overturn the

judgement of the tribunal.

With post-election litigations over and the governor's re-election duly affirmed by the Supreme Court on January 19, the high expectations of the people of the state, majorly because of the standard set by Governor Abiodun in his first term, demand that all involved come together in reconciliation to move the state forward.

Between Abiodun's legacy and Oluomo's fall

Already leading that reconciliation tone is no other person than Sir Kessington Adebutu, an industrialist and father of Hon. Adebutu. He congratulated Governor Abiodun on the revalidation of his re-election by the Supreme Court

and urged his son to join hands with the governor in the interest of the state after the apex court's verdict. In a letter addressed to Prince Abiodun, dated January 22, the senior Adebutu said he had counselled his son to sheathe the sword and join Abiodun in moving the

state forward. He also called for a peaceful meeting between Adebutu junior and the governor. Most importantly, he noted that the apex court's judgement had put an end to all matters of litigation surrounding the 2023 governorship election.

After his victory at the polls, Prince Abiodun promised that: "We will continue with the same vision of providing focused and purposeful governance. We will push our frontiers as the industrial, educational and religious capital of Nigeria. We are fast becoming the food basket in the South-West; so we have a lot to be thankful for. Please let us keep our eyes on the ball."

Embarking on the delivery of these promises and the completion of major projects in the state not only require strategic partnerships and collaboration. Ogun needs an enabling environment for industrial growth, manpower development, and creativity to thrive. Part of that enabling environment is for stakeholders, no matter their creed and political alignment, to close ranks and for the good of the state.

From that point, every political pundit thought the APC was on a roller coaster. It has successfully quelled internal opposition, winning all elements loyal to former Governor Ibikunle Amosun over. Weeks before, another APC lawmaker, Kunle Sobukunola, snatched victory from his PDP counterpart, Babajide Owodunni from the governor's constituency at the Appeal Court and the euphoria became more undiluted with more converts into the APC. That was when the lucre of leadership snapped for Oluomo, the governor's protege and the state's number three citizen.

Perhaps conscious that this is his second and final term, Abiodun understands that this is his "legacy term". He buckled under his place in history at the moment when not only governance but crisis, whether internal or external, would be a reflection of his stake in statesmanship. More than his first term, it is during this second term that history will record his administration's scorecard in terms of performance and his political dealings with friends and foes alike.

The crisis of confidence in the Ogun State House of Assembly did send a wrong signal about the willingness of the governor to foster reconciliation within his party as a benchmark for his ability to close ranks with other stakeholders outside his party. Despite describing Governor Abiodun as his benefactor and expressing gratitude for endorsing his candidacy for the speakership twice, embattled peaker of the Ogun State House of Assembly, Olakunle Oluomo, expressed disappointment in the lack of intervention from the governor and the leadership of the APC, which he had expected. He said the disappointment meant that he would have to seek justice elsewhere.

What a pity from someone who admitted there has been no lovelost relationship with his colleagues in the House. The governor's love and protection notwithstanding, it appears he left many things to chance. An ordinarily sagacious four-term lawmaker would have not been left in the lurch as it happened to him.

Nganjiwa, the judge as a verb

THERE is hardly any jurisdiction in the common law in which a man with his current record could possibly still sit as a judge of a superior court of record. In Nigeria, however, Hyeladzira Nganjiwa proudly sits on the bench of the Federal High Court and currently serves in Abakaliki, Ebonyi State in South-East Nigeria. From the bench, he has been embroiled in all sorts controversy lately .

Nganjiwa went to Government Secondary School, Damaturu, when it used to be part of Borno State, finishing in 1978. In 1979, University of Lagos admitted him to read law. In 1984, he enrolled to become a lawyer in Nigeria. Nganjiwa did his compulsory national service with the Ajaokuta Steel Company, before finishing it in 1985 with the Ministry of Justice in Ilorin when both were part of old Kwara

Thereafter, Nganjiwa returned to his native Borno State, from where he compiled a career as a public prosecutor, rising to the rank of Chief Legal Officer at the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency, NDLEA, until 1995, when he became Deputy Director of Public Prosecutions in the Borno State Ministry of Justice. Nganjiwa thereafter returned to private practice from where President Goodluck Jonathan appointed him a judge and he was sworn into the bench of the Federal High Court on May 28, 2012.

Less than a few years into his judicial career, Nganjiwa was accused of sundry allegations on which he was charged to

Persuaded that the judge was transacting in shady judicial business, the EFCC arraigned Nganjiwa a mere five years into his judicial career on June 23, 2017 on 14 counts of unlawful enrichment. This was a charge of judicial graft.

A judge who takes his office seriously will be affronted by such a charge and will make it a priority to clear his name. This was the least of Nganjiwa's concerns, however. Instead, he asserted impunity, claiming that the court could not try him when he had not yet been disciplined by the National Judicial Council, NJC. This was worse than an odd argument to make for three reasons

First, the NJC polices judicial misconduct alright but is neither the police nor a public prosecutor. Second, the NJC lacks the wherewithal by itself to investigate unlawful enrichment. Third, it was akin to province the policy of Code. of Conduct for Judicial Officers, which the NJC enforces, requires all judges to "respect and comply with the laws of the land..." That would include the laws on

unlawful enrichment.
At the High Court of Lagos, Justice Adeola Akintoye was not much persuaded by this objection and threw it out. Nganjiwa appealed to the Court of Appeal, which agreed with him. On December 11, 2017, the Court of Appeal ruled that he could not be prosecuted, unless the NJC had disciplined him on the matter. disciplined him on the matter.

Interestingly, in the same judgement, the Court observed that: "If a judicial officer commits theft, fraud, murder or manslaughter, arson and the likes, which are crimes committed outside the scope of the performance of his official functions, he may be arrested, interrogated and prosecuted accordingly by the State directly without recourse to the NJC." The Court of Appeal was able to see that theft, fraud, murder or manslaughter were not part of the job specification for a judge. But they seemed to believe that judicial corruption could be; but we digress.

A dissatisfied EFCC appealed to the Supreme Court, which at the end of May 2022, threw out the appeal and discharged Nganjiwa. It did not acquit him though. So, the Supreme Court set him free but fully blemished with the whiff of judicial corruption.

In any other jurisdiction, this would have been the end of Nganjiwa's judicial career but in the weird logic of the NJC, however, it was its rejuvenation instead. On the 10th anniversary of his appointment as a judge of the Federal High Court, Nganjiwa, who had been under suspension all these years while the proceedings went on, returned to the bench with a license once

more to go judging.

Last November, the latest postings by the Chief Judge of the Federal High Court took Nganjiwa to Abakaliki. As if by divine synch, one month later on December 20, Godswill Akpabio, president of the Senate, formally declared vacancies in respect of certain seats in the upper chamber,

including that for Ebonyi South, formerly represented by David Umahi who now serves as a Minister in the federal cabinet.

serves as a Minister in the federal cabinet. Two days thereafter, on December 22, the Independent National Electoral Commission, INEC, issued a notice of byelections covering the seats which the Senate president had declared vacant. It required the parties to conduct their primaries for purposes of selecting their candidates between January 5 and 9, and to complete candidate nomination to complete candidate nomination formalities by January 13. In all, the parties had 17 days (including week-ends) to complete candidate selection and another

four days to complete all filings with INEC. The Commission fixed actual voting in the by-elections for February 3.

On January 9, five persons claiming to be "intending delegates" in the primaries of the Peoples Democratic Party, PDP, initiated proceedings in Nganjiwa's court in suit no. FHC/AI/CS/6/2024 between Chief Stanley Okochie Nkaa & 4 Others v. PDP, INEC & 2 Others, asking the judge to exclude the party from the by-election because the selection of its candidate, Silas Onu, four days earlier, was not preceded by 21 days' notice. The law actually only allows aspirants to sue.

In the course of the proceedings, one of the named plaintiffs told the court that he had not instructed anyone to initiate the case in his name. His name was removed from the list of parties. That should have told most judges that something was not right. But not this one.

But 23 days after the case was filed, on February 1, Nganjiwa issued a 57-page judgement granting the claimants everything they asked for. He specifically issued "an order of perpetual injunction" restraining INEC from recognising the PDP candidate in the by-election, "and his name shall not be included in the election".

This was exactly two days before the byelection. As a practical matter, this was not an order that the INEC could have complied with without postponing the ballot in Ebonyi South because it had printed all the ballot papers and deployed significant electoral capability ahead of the date. As most sensible lawyers know, injunctions are equitable remedies and equity does not act in vain.

Having made these serious orders against INEC (a defendant) in the proceedings, however, Nganjiwa very curiously also awarded costs of one million Naira in its favour to be paid by the PDP and its candidate whom he had just directed the Commission to exclude.

In the course of his judgment, Nganjiwa felt called upon to justify why he had to accept everything INEC said as gospel. He described the Commission as "an unbiased Empire" (sic), proclaiming that as the reason why he had "no doubt in my mind to doubt whatever information(s) supplied by the (INEC)" (sic).

When you end up with a court judgement that induces moral and jurisprudential indigestion on this scale, there is a word for it: you have been Nganjiwad.

Kakistocracy and our predicament

THIS piece is inspired by a quaint TIK TOK video sent to me by a witty former colleague at the defunct *ABUJA NEWSDAY*. The TIK TOK video unveils a new word called Kakistocracy. It challenges the viewer to Google it. At first blush my mind went to military rule. But upon Googling it, this writer discovered that Kakistocracy refers to "government by the least suitable or competent citizens of a state". It also refers to "a state or society governed by its least suitable or competent citizens"

Kakistocracy derives from two Greek words, namely: Kakisto (worst) and astos(rule). Though *Kakist* draws its etymology or roots from Greek, and though it appears novel and strange, it was coined as early as the 17th century. Thus it was merely exhumed to reflect our prevailing circumstances. What strikes me, and I am certain what informed my colleague's forwarding of this TIK TOK video, must be its aptness or appropriateness to our national predicament and the serial, inept leaderships that have brought us to

Consider their catalogue and sundry foibles: To herald the Second Republic, the then military administration led by General Olusegun Obasanjo allowed the registration of five political parties to contest the 1979 elections. They were: the National Party of Nigeria, NPN; Nigeria Peoples Party, NPP; Great Nigeria Peoples Party, GNPP; Peoples Redemption Party, PRP; and the Unity Party of Nigeria, UPN. The standard bearers of these five parties were: Alhaji Shehu Shagari, Dr. Nnamdi Azikwe, Alhaji Waziri Ibrahim, Malam Aminu Kano and Chief Obafemi Awolowo respectively. These were not only distinguished politicians and household names,

some of them had their pedigrees in the struggle for Nigeria's independence and the First Republic. Dr. Azikiwe and Chief Awolowo were notably distinguished by their erudition and technocratic abilities. Zik was urbane and cosmopolitan. Awolowo was famously deliberate and purposive, two attributes the renowned novelist, China Achebe, associated with the politician. Aminu Kano was distinguished by his integrity and spartan disposition. Waziri Ibrahim was a business mogul who had cut his teeth at the United

Africa Company, UAC. How Alhaji Shehu Shagari emerged as the NPN's standard bearer and later governed from 1979 to 1983 is revealing. He had earlier shown interest only in being a Senator. And upon learning that some bigwigs of his party were rooting for him to contest the presidency, he took off to Germany to avoid their pressure. Highly competent contestants such as Adamu Čiroma, Olusola Saraki and Maitama Sule were short shrifted in Shagari's favour. His unique selling point was that he was meek. The upshot of his preference by his party's caucus was that hawks such as Dr. Umaru Dikko took over the reigns of power. The country then had a scenario in which lions were being led by a lamb. President Shagari's helplessness was such that Umaru Dikko, Dr. Ibrahim Tahir and their ilk spoke condescendingly to their compatriots. The economy went downhill. It took Chief Awolowo, who had returned to the country from a "spiritual rejuvenation" abroad, to awaken the government from its slumber and to the dire straits in which the economy was.

Chief Awolowo, whose bonafides as an astute manager of resources preceded him, never became president until he died on May 9, 1987. One of Nigeria's best journalists, Mr. Dan Agbese, referred to him as "the best President Nigeria never had". Chief Chukwuemeka Odumegwu Ojukwu, the former Biafran leader, was to repeat the same refrain at Chief Awolowo's death.

In 1983, following the excesses of the NPN-led Federal Government, and the brazenly rigged elections of that year, the military took over. Major General Muhammadu Buhari, as he then was, was invested with the positions of Head of State and Commander-in-Chief by his fellow putschists. Not only was his government draconian and vengeful, he outsourced its administration to the dour and unsmiling deputy, Brigadier-General Tunde Idiagbon. Enter General Ibrahim Babangida. He, with his colleagues, overthrew the granite-hearted Buhari in a palace coup on August 27, 1985. Whereas General Babangida demonstrated a modicum of preparedness to ascend to high office and he surrounded himself with very capable persons, his eight-year tenure was undermined by an uncommon wiliness and the annulment of the 1993 presidential election. The election was adjudged as one of the best in the country's annals.

General Sani Abacha, who edged out the illicit Interim National Government, ING, led by Chief Ernest Shonekan, was a good manager of the economy. The Naira enjoyed a measure of stability under his watch. His ruthlessness was his undoing. He governed in an atmosphere of fear and Nigeria became a pariah on the

world stage.

Former President Muhammadu Buhari, who touted and marketed himself as a person of high integrity and someone who would address the country's serious security concerns, proved a resounding failure. At the end of the day, the economy plunged to its nadir. Insecurity reached its apogee. Army personnel guarding the presidential villa were attacked in Abuja. The presidential convoy, was for the first time, ambushed on its way to Daura. The Correction Centre at Kuje, less than 60 kilometers to the Three Arms Zone, housing the presidential villa, the Supreme Court and the National Assembly, was attacked. Incarcerated terrorists were

Before his advent to power, his handlers marketed President Bola Ahmed Tinubu as experienced and thorough. They latched onto his eightyear tenure as Governor of Lagos State, Nigeria's mega city, to argue their case. Alas, since his inauguration, his government has been framed by haphazardness and impulsiveness. In fact, his first act of withdrawal of fuel subsidy, without much of a forethought or a plan regarding its deleterious consequences, knocks the bottom out propensity to abdicate responsibility or fail to show leadership. In a week when violence raged on the Plateau. traditional rulers were killed by unknown gunmen in Ekiti State, scores of school children were abducted in Ekiti and Benue States and 30 others were killed in Agatu Local Government of Benue State. the president is said to be paying a private visit to France! It may not be outlandish, in these unfortunate circumstances, to draw parallels with Nero. He once fiddled while Rome

WITH about 36.9 million hectares of arable land, representing 40.48 per cent of the country's total land area as at 2021, and 70 per cent of youth population (151 million youths), Nigerians should have no reason to be hungry.

But unfortunately, there is serious hunger in the land. In the just released 2023 Global Hunger Index, GHI, Nigeria was ranked 109th out of 125 countries, with a score of 28.3 per cent, where countries that scored 20.0-34.9 have serious hunger. It means that Nigeria is the 16th most hungry country in the world amongst countries with sufficient data to calculate the 2023 GHI scores.

Interestingly, Nigeria was ranked below countries like Sudan, Zimbabwe, DR Congo, North Korea and Guinea.

The Global Hunger Index is a peer-reviewed annual report, jointly published by Concern Worldwide and Welthungerhilfe, one of Germany's biggest private organisations for development and humanitarian aid. The GHI is

designed to comprehensively measure and track hunger at the global, regional and country levels.

Among Nigeria's economic activities, agriculture is one of the lowest hanging fruits that could have bailed the country out of its present economic crisis. But the present government appears to have little or no interest in that sector, nor is it able to stop terrorists from chasing farmers away from their farmlands.

As a result, Nigeria is buffeted with a record high inflation rate of 28.92 per cent, a food inflation rate of 33.93 per cent driven by astronomical increases in prices of staple food items, and a


Hunger may not be a justification for stealing, but hunger is fuelling

In the past six years, Nigeria's hunger statistics has been on the rise. In 2017, 10 per cent of Nigeria's population suffered severe hunger. In 2018, it rose to 10.40 per cent. By 2019 it became 12 per cent. In 2020 it was 12.70 per cent. Between 2020 and 2022, on average, 21.3 per cent of Nigeria's population experienced hunger.

According to the World Food Programme, about 26.5 million people across Nigeria are projected to face acute hunger in 2024, a staggering increase from the 18.6 million people that suffered hunger at the end of 2023.

A hungry man, they say, is an angry man. Government at all levels need to sit up. If this level of hunger continues, there is no telling what the people will

CBN and Cardoso's bid to restore stability, sanity in financial system

The mandate of the Central Bank of Nigeria, CBN, is derived from the 1958 Act of Parliament that established the Bank. The Act has been amended six times since then to respond to contemporary challenges and the expansion of the economy. The Act was amended in 1991, 1993, 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2007.

The CBN Act of 2007 therefore charges the Bank with the overall control and administration of the monetary and financial sector policies of the Federal Government.

The mandate of the CBN, therefore, is to ensure monetary and price stability, issue legal tender currency in Nigeria, maintain external reserves to safeguard the international value of the legal tender currency, promote a sound financial system in Nigeria, and act as Banker and provide economic and financial advice to the Federal Government.

The Bank is also charged with the responsibility of administering the Banks and Other Financial Institutions, BOFI, Act (1991), as amended, with the sole aim of ensuring high standards of banking practice and financial stability through its surveillance activities, as well as the promotion of an efficient payment system.

In addition to its core functions, CBN has over the years performed some major developmental functions, focused on all the key sectors of the Nigerian economy (financial, agricultural and industrial sectors). Overall, these mandates are carried out by the Bank through its various departments.

Monetary Policy Committee, MPC

The MPC is the highest policy making committee of the Bank with the mandate to review economic and financial conditions in the economy; determine appropriate stance of policy

in the short to medium term; review regularly, the CBN monetary policy framework and adopt changes when necessary; and communicate monetary/financial policy decisions effectively to the public and ensure the credibility of the model of transmission mechanism of monetary policy.

The CBN Act 2007 states inter alia: "In order

The CBN Act 2007 states inter alia: "In order to facilitate the attainment of the objective of price stability and to support the economic policy of the Federal Government, there shall be a Committee of the Bank known as the Monetary Policy Committee (in this Act referred to as 'the MPC')."

The MPC consists of the governor of the CBN, who doubles as the chairman of the committee; the four deputy governors of the Bank; the two members of the board of directors of the Bank; three members appointed by the President; and two members appointed by the CBN governor. The MPC meeting is held for two consecutive

The MPC meeting is held for two consecutive days once every two months. On the second day, journalists are briefed on the outcome of the meeting and they have an opportunity to quiz the CBN governor on the latest interest rate, exchange rate, measures to curb inflationary pressure and so on.

The Committee meeting has however suffered a series of postponements since July last year when it held its last meeting, with the attendant consequences. Due to this lack of direction, we have seen impact in the chaos and instability in the monetary side of the economy.

The Economic Confidential reports that MPC held its last meeting which was the 292nd on July 24 and 25, 2023, when members voted to marginally increase the Monetary Policy Rate, MPR, from 18.5 per cent to 18.75 per cent.

The Bank postponed the MPC meeting scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, September 25 and 26, which would have been the first meet-

ing under Yemi Cardoso.

The meeting would have enabled him to face the press to answer questions about what he is doing on the free fall of the Naira among other pertinent issues troubling the economy.

That was the second time the MPC meeting

had been postponed since the Committee was established. The first time was in January 2020 when the first MPC meeting of the year was postponed from January 20-21 to January 23-24.

This means that postponement of MPC meetings is a rare occurrence which may be due to the fact that Mr Cardoso was settling down in his new office

Despite the surge in inflation, which hit 27.33 per cent in October 2023, and high expectation of the new CBN leadership, the apex Bank leadership postponed the MPC meeting again in November 2023.

In the process of understanding the rot he met in the system and how to pull the economy out of the hole he met it, Mr Cardoso decided to put certain parameters in place before resum-

ing MPC meetings.

Meanwhile, inflation has hit 30 percent while the Naira continues to decline against the Dollar as Nigerians continue to groan over declining purchasing power in the midst of rising prices of goods.

Respite at Last

As part of measures to start the new year on a fresh and reassuring note, the CBN held a two-day strategic session for members of the MPC a fortnight ago.

The session was preparatory to its first meeting under Mr Cardoso which is scheduled for Monday, February 26 and Tuesday, February 27.

According to the apex Bank's spokesperson, Mrs. Hakama Sidi-Ali, the session was meant for members to brainstorm and engage in an in-depth discussion about the committee's objectives.

She revealed that the critical focus areas during the retreat included deliberations on the strategic plan to effect necessary improvement in the monetary policy transmission mechanism.

According to her, the sessions were facilitated by former MPC members, monetary policy communication specialists at the IMF and Directors of Departments critical to the MPC process.

"The valuable insights gained from these discussions will significantly contribute towards the robustness of the forthcoming MPC meetings," she noted.

To underscore the Bank's seriousness this year, a calendar of meetings of the MPC for 2024 was published on the CBN website and it indicates that the meetings have been scheduled for February, March, May, July, September and November.

Uncertainty rules currency markets as external reserves rise

THERE is heightened uncer Lainty in the currency market over the fortunes of the Naira this week, with investment analysts highlighting factors that will trigger further depreciation as well as the impact on Nigerians and the economy.

While noting that the 61 per cent depreciation of the Naira last week has worsened confidence in the national currency and would lead to further rise in the cost of goods and services as well as increase debt service, they warned that risks of further depreciation exists until the Central Bank of Nigeria, CBN curtails growth in money supply, punishes currency manipulators and clears the backlog of mature dollar obligations estimated at \$5 billion.



Data from the CBN showed that the external reserves rose to \$33.35 billion on January 30th from \$32.192 billion in December last year.



This is in sharp contrast to the persistent decline recorded in the external reserves in 2023. The reserves declined all through the months of 2023 except the very marginal increase in October.

Consequently, the reserve closed the year at \$32.192 billion, a 13.2 per cent or \$4.89 billion loss from \$37 .082 billion it recorded at end of 2022.

The increase in external reserves which also signifies improvement in foreign exchange inflow during the month may not be uncon-

Describing what triggered the 61 per cent depreciation of the Naira in NAFEM, Co-Founder, Comercio Partners Limited, Nnamdi Nwizu, said: "It was market forces at work, alongside the government. The CBN decided to tackle the illegal transactions in the market that were distorting real market transparency, but getting banks to truly show where trades were being consummated, versus the trend where some close trades

"Companies that depend on imported raw materials will continue to struggle with high costs, potentially reducing their profitability and competitiveness. This can lead to job losses and or price increases;

"A weaker Naira will facilitate uncertainty in the economy and foreign investors will become: disinterested in investing in the nomy. This will limit of foreign exchange and hinder economic growth;

"The country, firms and individuals that borrowed in foreign currency will need more Naira to repay their debts as well as the interest rates thereon;

"The continuous weakening of the Naira will increase the debt servicing burden of the country, firms, and individuals.'

Similarly, Nwizu stressed that with higher exchange rates will come higher inflation.

"We are also getting to the point where Nigerians are losing faith in the Naira and we are getting to a dollarized economy. If the monetary authorities do not stem the depreciation tide, it will be

Impact of Foreign investment

Anaba also highlighted how the recent Naira depreciation will impact foreign investment inflow to the country, saying, "Foreign investors report their returns in Dollar terms. A quently shrink the Dollar value of their return on investments. This makes Nigerian investments less attractive compared to other options, potentially deterring new inflows, and even leading to the exit of foreign investors and withdrawal of funds from the Nigerian

"Increased volatility in the exchange rate creates uncertainty for investors, making it difficult to assess risks and returns accurately. This can further discourage investment, especially for long term projects.

"A weaker Naira often underlying

macroeconomic headwinds like inflation or political instability etc. These concerns can further dampen investors' confidence and reduce their appetite for riskier emerging markets like Ni-

Similarly, Nwizu said: "On Foreign Direct Investment Foreign Portfolio Investment, the higher rate should make it more attractive for them to come in. Only missing ingredients are higher short term rates, dollar liquidity and market confidence in the currency."

Outlook for this week

The analysts, however, expressed uncertainty over the direction of the exchange rate this week. saying it all depends on actions of the CBN.

According to Omoyeni of Vetiva Capital Management Limited. 'Nigeria needs increased foreign exchange supply to anchor its decisions.

'On the other hand, Nigeria needs to return to monetary targeting as Money Supply continues to grow at an alarming rate.

"The CBN needs to keep money growth within the required limits and sterilize when they exceed those limits via higher interest rates and more frequent OMO auctions. The future outcome of the Naira will be determined by the actions and inactions of the apex bank.'

Partners also said: "A lot depends on the new CBN circular around the Net Open Position of banks and the size of open positions the banks have to sell. If it is sizable, then we should see an aggressive decline in exchange rates."

Naira depreciation may continue

Anaba however pointed out that any improvement in the exchange rate will be temporary, as the fundamental issues affecting the weakening of the Naira abound.

Highlighting the fundamental issues, he said: "The

Naira is on a continuous fall due to the following: Limited Supply of Dollar: Nigeria's major source of Foreign Exchange (FX) is crude oil exports. Nevertheless, crude oil production has fallen short of OPEC's quota due to several challenges, resulting in a reduction in FX earnings. 'Unabating Demand for

Dollar: Nigeria heavily depends on importation of goods. This creates a confor both households and businesses. Consequently, the demand for Dollar has outpaced the limited supply, thus putting pressure on the Naira.

"Limited Exports: The export base of Nigeria is narrow, heavily dependent on oil. The non-oil sector contribution has been very low, hence the current struggle with FX earnings.

"Low Investor Confidence: Investors' concerns regarding elevated inflation, heightened insecurity, policy summersault, and uncertainty in the economy have negatively affected foreign investments, further limiting

FX inflows, and weakening the Naira. The government's efforts to resuscitate the Naira have become ineffective due to lack of confidence in the currency and in the economy.

"Currency Speculators: The activities of currency speculators in the FX market have exacerbated the free fall of the Naira.

"Foreign Exchange Backlogs of \$7.0 Billion: Investors' funds have been trapped over the years, and this has contributed to lack of confidence in the economy as the government struggles to settle the backlogs. Consequently, this has contributed to the continuous fall of the Naira as the CBN concentrates more on the settlement of these backlogs rather than supporting the Naira at the market.

"Foreign Assets: Due to the continuous depreciation of the Naira, most investors have abandoned Nigerian assets for foreign assets and crypto assets. Some investors have decided to invest in gold, precious metals, US Dollar, and foreign securities etc."

ND, as somebody has also reminded us: "As a people normally gets the government it deserves, so a society normally receives the punishment it asks for." To me, it is now a precious waste of time whenever a frequent reader of this page calls to register his/her agreement with my article — only to launch into questioning Tinubu's legitimacy as President. Millions of highly educated Nigerians have not developed the emotional maturity which makes it possible to accept with serenity what cannot be changed. Tinubu is President and nobody else. And, to him, I will continue to address myself. Cardoso is also Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria. He will also be the focus of my attention. Nobody else.

That said; to me, the controversy over relocation of some units of the CBN to Lagos is vintage Nigerian stupidity. Neither those for nor against made a logical case from start to finish. It was a very emotional outburst all around — distracting us from the more vital issues regarding the CBN's vital roles in the Nigerian economy. Nobody has advanced a credible reason why the change would help to stabilise exchange rates and check inflation or hinder

Permit me therefore to remind Nigerians once again about forecasts that we have made in Vanguard about the Nigerian economy in the past and for 2024. For the sake of those impatient with reading long articles, let me quickly summarise first and explain lat-

First, it should be clear to all those capable of quantitative analysis that N2,000/\$1 is already a reality before the end of the first quarter or early second quarter. Nothing the CBN does can avert that disaster.

Second, even with only a month gone, the 2024 Budget is already in the dustbin. The major indices, except one, will be missed. Oddly enough, the aggregate revenue target might be achieved or even surpassed. But, that will be at the expense of higher inflation led by deeper devaluation of the naira.

Third, Nigerians, expecting fuel price relief when Dangote starts supplying the domestic market are in for a shock. Dangote will not buy crude with dollars and sell for naira – unless dollar recovery is assured. Forget Port Harcourt refinery. The FG is just throwing good money after bad into the cesspool.

Irrespective of who controls Geregu Disco and others, power failure and grid collapse will continue throughout 2024.

Why N3,000/\$ is a possibility this year

There are no desperate situations; only desperate men."-Joseph Goebbels, 1897-1945, Hitler's Chief of Propaganda.

A nation in serious political and economic distress can be easily identified by the rapid releases of new regulations, guidelines, and Executive Orders which leave all the stakeholders totally perplexed. Since the beginning of January this year, the CBN has issued more new instructions to banks and other stakeholders in the economy than I can remember since 1987 - when I first started writing on this page. The most pathetic thing about all these releases lies in the fact that they evoke different and sometimes contradictory responses from all the stakeholders.

But, it is not only the CBN which is living in a fantasy world

devoid of reality. Some, if not all, of Tinubu's Special Advisers have also caught what I once described as the Aso Rock Disease. I described it as an illness afflicting people who built a reputation before entering the Rock; only to murder their reputation after their tenure there. Two recent examples will help us along in this journey regarding what to expect on exchange rate.

The first, shortly after his appointment, went on television to announce that Tinubu's policies will soon bring down the exchange rate to N600/\$1. Soon, as media veterans already know, is no promise and frequently deliberately deceptive.

The second, one of our dearest — Editor, Publisher and a staunch Abacha fighter — sent a press release two weeks ago; when the Pump and Dump operators on the Nigerian Stock Exchange were busy duping gullible Nigerian NGX investors. He took credit for the bubble on behalf of the FG. I wonder how he and the FG now feel - when the entire thing is now turning out to be a swindle of the un-

wary by the powerful Nigerians; who organised the scam.

Today, it is N1,400/\$1. By contrast, on December 30, 2023, I specifically stated that all FG'S projections will turn out to be wrong as the year runs out. No forecast for the likely trend of exchange rate was made then. Let me make one now. Like all predictions based on the existing national and global situations, the outcome could be different. But, I can rightly claim credit as the only economist in the entire world who predicted that the exchange rate would hit N1,000/\$1 in 2023. The World Bank, the International Monetary Fund, the CBN, Nigerian Economic Summit Group and Nigerian experts all failed us. They failed to warn Nigerians about the calamity we encountered in 2023. That was bad enough. They are failing us again.

Today is February 5, 2024, and the exchange rate is N1400/\$1. Meanwhile, the Budget was based on N750/ \$1. The CBN has since then adjusted the official rate to N950/\$1 - all in less than amonth. Yesterday, the Bureaux De Change closed shop – just as the ČBN rolled out another quideline asking banks to push out their dollar reserves. That, to me, must be a joke, indicating that Mr Cardoso and the top management of the CBN are totally out of touch with reality at the ground level of banking. Here is why.

Mr X, almost 80, a real Nigerian, believe me, operating a Domicilliary account with a bank for years, urgently needed naira. He called the bank requesting \$1,000 to be released. "Not available". That was the bank's response. "How about \$500?" "Okay, you can come for that."

The poor fellow arrived at the bank only to be told that there was no dollar left. However, they will direct him to another branch which had \$300 in small notes.

Despite being physically challenged, he walked to the other branch to collect with and gratitude feeling humiliated, a small fraction of what he deposited with the bank - with ease. He has vowed never to deposit another dollar in a bank in Nigeria. He is not alone. Just as millions of Nigerians no longer deposit excess naira in banks, thousands will no longer pay dollars into their Domicilliary accounts. If Cardoso wants to know the truth, he will have to leave that mausoleum erected as CBN Headquarters and talk to Nigerians outside official circles. Right now, he is leading Nigeria into economic calamity. The other experts won't tell him the truth. But, he will receive it here; and here it is.

N2,000/\$1 is inescapable this year; N3,000/\$1 is a possibility. The reasons are not hard to discover. Permit me to mention just two for now.

Crude oil exports and fuel supply

Two things should worry all of us. Dangote Refinery was not established solely to supply Nigerian fuel demand. He will not buy crude from the US in dollars and sell the fuel in naira – unless at the price dictated by the prevailing exchange rate. Yet, he will receive crude allocations from Nigeria; and reduce dollar revenue....

Widening pathway to quality education crucial to national growth — *Ewherido*

Mrs. Tolulope Ewherido chairs the Board of Trustees of the i-Scholar Initiative (iSI), a non-profit organisation that mentors and connects high-potential African students to fully funded graduate programmes in top global universities. Mrs. Ewherido leads a team of other Board members in providing strategic direction for the iSI mission. iSI has empowered and placed over 250 young and bright Nigerians in world class universities in the USA and around the world. Over 80% of these young scholars are currently running graduate programmes in STEMS including Geosciences. She speaks on some of the things iSI has achieved in the last few years. Excerpts.

INCE the inauguration of Since the management of the i-scholar initiative in 2019, how would you describe the impact on the students? What feedback do you get?

Since 2019, our focus has primarily been in Nigeria, achieving an impressive 5X growth in sponsorships within the first four years. With an investment of about \$160,000, we've sponsored over 255 scholars, accessing scholarships totalling over \$25 million. Nigeria has an abundance of talents with the potential to drive economic innovation and transformation. A testament to this is the significant impact Nigerians are making in academia, industries, and businesses in Nigeria, Africa and across the globe. However, a notable challenge exists - access to global education that can further drive innovation and higher economic outcomes has narrowed over time to mostly individuals who are financially privileged. iSI is creating a bridge: "we are catalysts, that say our scholars' dreams of higher education and better economic attainment are as valid as those of individuals who come from more privileged backgrounds, and we are dedicated to helping them realise these dreams. The benefits of our efforts extend in multiple directions – to the individuals, their communities, and Nigeria as a whole. Beyond the immeasurable, compounding economic advantages that uplift families and communities, there are tangible, measurable impacts. The success stories of our scholars speak for themselves. Here are three examples, in their own words.:

Ayomide Akande (First-Class B.Sc. Chemistry, fully funded PhD in Chemistry, Canada.) "It is really beyond just getting funded for my GRE. The proximity and access to our sponsors, the advice, the regular encouraging words and even the networking among fellow scholars makes ISI different from similar initiatives. I had access to mentors and met remarkable people that gingered me to achieve my dreams.'

Abdulwaris Ajagunjeun, (First-Class B.Sc. Geology, fully funded MSc. in Petroleum Geoscience, UAE): "My GRE and TOEFL exams were sponsored by iSI, but iSI has transcended mere sponsorship it was a supportive family during a crucial time in my life journey. The firsthand information, mentorship, and support from iSI, from mentors and fellow scholars, played a significant role in turning my aspirations into reality. Finally, the indigent boy is achieving his dreams. iSI is not just an organisation; it's a community of motivated individuals who instill hope and reassure you that the goodness you've been waiting for is on its way. Indeed, iSI is the best."

Emenike Goodluck (First-Class B.Sc Electrical & Electronics Engineering, fully funded PhD in Systems Engineering, USA): "In 2019, I stumbled upon the i-Scholars Initiative (iSI), an unfamiliar concept where someone beyond my family could sponsor my GRE/TOEFL tests. The idea of a stranger investing in my dreams felt surreal. Despite the skepticism I applied with a "nothing to lose" mindset.

To my astonishment, I received the iSI scholarship in September 2019— \$220 for GRE, \$195 for TOEFL, and an additional \$70 for test materials. As I prepared for the tests, iSI provided more than financial aid valuable advisory services, networking, and mentorship. As a youth corps member in Plateau State earning less than \$50/month, this financial and moral support was a huge beacon of hope to continue the struggle. I extend heartfelt gratitude to the generous sponsors and visionaries behind the i-Scholars Initiative. Your benevolence and commitment to the success of young Nigerian scholars is creating a positive change with tremendous impact.

How have you been able to leverage the network of partners to ensure that students from less privileged background get scholarships?

Our partners are volunteers and donors who support with their time and money. iŠĪ Partners serve as the lifeblood of our organisation, providing vital support on various fronts. Financially, their contributions play a crucial role, covering multiple tests, application fees, and offering loans for flights and initial settling expenses for each scholar. Beyond financial aid, our partners contribute immeasurable support through their time and passion. With over 300 accomplished partners globally, our network is a testament to the collaborative spirit that drives our mission. These dedicated individuals volunteer their expertise in reviewing applications, participating in scholar selection, hosting webinars, and providing valuable assistance in interview preparation for visas and universities. Their

one mentoring throughout the entire application process and continues even after scholars have embarked on their graduate programmes. Our partners truly embody the spirit of collaboration and mentorship, making a significant impact on the success of our scholars.

What is your view about Japa

syndrome?
The phenomenon of "Japa" is a natural response to individuals seeking opportunities beyond what is currently available to them in Nigeria, with the aim of improving their own lives and the lives of their families. This inclination aligns with Maslow's hierarchy of needs, where the motivation for change is driven by unmet basic human needs. Nigeria has the largest population of youth in the world, about 70% of Nigeria's population of greater than 200 Million people is under 30 years, and 42% is under the age of 15. Rather than opposing the trend of Japa, our focus should be on expanding opportunities for Nigerian youth to thrive within the country and abroad. In 2022, remittances from Nigerians living abroad amounted to approximately \$20 billion, constituting about 4% of Nigeria's GDP. To put this in perspective, the oil sector, a significant contributor to GDP, accounted for approximately 6% in the same year. This highlights the substantial contribution of Nigerians, both within and outside the country, to our national growth. iSI plays a crucial role in reshaping individual economic trajectories, and enabling more Nigerians to contribute to the leadership, innovation, and overall development of the nation—whether they are in

Nigeria or part of the Diaspora. For the Nigerian students who have gone through the programme, how do you encourage them to come back and contribute to the development of the country?

Let's dispel the notion that contributing to a country's development is contingent solely on physical presence within its borders. This belief is a false ideology. While it's crucial to have a workforce propelling the economy from within, the responsibility to foster this lies with the government, private enterprises, and public entities. National development also necessitates a segment of the population equipped with the right knowledge and higher education both home and abroad to drive innovation and transformation. This is

running a school like Dansol is expensive as technology is key. Focus on skills acquisition, leadership, sports and getting good teachers who are paid well, and the cost of power generation are some of the features that make our school, a fee-paying one.

"So, the government needs to give private schools interventions. In South Africa, whether you are running a Muslim or Christian school, you are given support by the government. Because they know that the private schools are helping them, they support the payment of teachers' salaries.

"We will be happy if the gov-ernment of Nigeria can do like South Africa, or support private primary schools with loans at a reduced rate. Imagine, everything I built here was at over 20 percent interest. Reduced interest rate and support to pay staff are areas government should look into for support of those running private schools." Akinyemiju reiterated.



RE-RUN, BYE-ELECTIONS: Mixed fortunes as five parties win seats

•APC 12, PDP 7, YPP 4, NNPP 3, APGA 1

 $IT was \, mixed \, for tunes \, for \, five \, political \,$ parties as the results of Saturday's rerun and bye-elections for 57 legislative seats across 26 states trickled in.

The Independent National Electoral Commission, INEC, held bye-elections for two Senatorial, four House of Representatives and three State Assembly seats to replace members who passed on or resigned their memberships of National and States Assembly in nine states. Also, re-run elections were held to fill vacancies for three senatorial, 17 House of Representatives and 28 state assembly slots. Altogether, five senatorial, 21 Reps, 31 state assembly seats were

Of the 27 results released as of press time, yesterday, the All Progressives Congress, APC, won 12 seats including two of the five senatorial slots contested. The main opposition Peoples Democratic Party, PDP, cornered seven seats; the Young Progressives Party, YPP, won four; the New Nigeria Peoples Party, NNPP, had three; and the All Progressives Grand Alliance, APGA, got one.

APC wins Rep, PDP wins two State Assembly seats in Cross River

Dr Emil Inyang of the APC, won the re-run election in Akamkpa/Biase Federal Constituency of Cross River State while Dr. Martins Achadu and Pius Ashakia, both of the PDP won the Yala II and Obanliku State House of Assembly seats respectively.

Results from the collation centres shows that APC won in 15 polling units $while\,PDP\,4\,in\,Akamkpa/Biase\,Federal$ Constituency re-run just as PDP won majority of votes cast in 13 polling units in Yala II as declared by Mrs. Dorathy Inyang, while Pius Ashakia had earlier been declared winner of Obanliku State Constituency by the electoral official.

Uzokwe win Nnewi North, Nnewi South, and Ekwusigo Reps seat

In Anambra, YPP's Peter Uzokwe emerged winner of the rerun election for Nnewi North, Nnewi South and Ekwusigo Federal Constituency.

Uzokwe, who was on Saturday evening locked out at the headquarters of Nnewi North Local Government Collation Centre by soldiers on the alleged order of the Anambra State Government, polled 25,518 votes to beat his APGA closest rival, who scored 25,412 votes.

In a similar development, Mrs. Chinwe Nnabuife of the YPP, got 14,416 votes to win the Orumba North and South Federal Constituency. In the rerun poll held in Nanka ward 1, she defeated the candidate of the PDP, Mr. Okwudili Ezenwankwo, who polled 13,087 votes.

PDP Wins Yabo/Shagari Reps seat in Sokoto

For the Yabo/ Shagari Federal Constituency re-run poll in Sokoto, Umar Yusuf Yabo of the PDP emerged as winner after scoring 26,829 votes to defeat APC's Abubakar Bukari, who got 26.113 votes at the heated contest. Bukari, was a member of the last House of Representatives

NNPP clinches two more state assembly seats in Kano

The NNPP clinched two more Kano State House of Assembly seats in by winning Kura/Garun Malam constituency and Rimingado/Tofa constituency.

The INEC Returning officer in

Kura/Garun Malam, Prof. Shehu Musa Galadanchi declared NNPP's Alhassan Zakariya Ishaq as the winner of the rerun election.

Zakariya polled 37,262 votes to beat Musa Hayatu Daurawar of the APC, who scored 30,803 votes.

In the same vein, Alhaji Bello Butu-Butu of NNPP scored 31,135 votes to floor his APC opponent that got 25,577 votes.

Thet INEC suspended the election in Kunchi/Tsanyawa following constituency irregularities that marred the election in the area.

PDP wins two seats in Sokoto

The result of the jre-run election in Sokoto shows that PDP is still waxing strong in the state by winning one national and one state assembly seats.

The Returning Officer for Yabo/ Shagari Federal Constituency rerun election, Prof. Abubakar Abdullahi Bagudo, announced PDP's Yusuf Umar Yabo as winner after he polled 26,829 votes. His closest rival, Umar Abubakar of the APC scored 26,113 votes.

In the same vein, Prof Farouk Tambuwal who served as Returning Officer for Bodinga North State Constituency, said Magaji Abubakar of the PDP polled 6,488 votes to defeat Yusuf Marafa Danchadi of the APC, who garnered 5,893 votes.

However, the Returning Officer for Tambuwal North State Constituency, Prof. Bayero Bukkuvum Kasim, declared Bashir Ahmed Dahiru of the APC as winner of the election having scored 19,315 votes to defeat PDP's Hantsi Sule Romo who got 19,021 votes.

APC's Alapala clinches victory in Burutu Constituency

In Delta, the INEC, once again declared Alapala Ebitonmo of the APC as winner of the Delta Assembly rerun election for Burutu Constituency 1.

Alapala was declared winner by INEC in 2023 but his victory was challenged in court by the then incumbent lawmaker of the ruling PDP, Asupa Forteta.

At the re-run election held at Ayakoromor Unit 8, Oboro Unit 9, Enekorogha Unit 26 and Edegbene Unit 27, Alapala polled 7, 728 votes to beat Forteta, who got 6, 616 votes.

APC's Mustapha grabs Yobe East senatorial seat

In Yobe, the INEC declared Musa Mustapha of the APC as the winner of the Yobe East Senatorial bye-Election.

Mustapha scored 68,778 votes to floor Aji Kolomi (Ajiko) of the PDP, who got 18,878 votes

PDP wins Mayo Belwa constituency in Adamawa

In Adamawa, PDP's Mahmud Kallam scored 1306 votes to beat his APC's challenger, Ibrahim. Musa Italiya (874 votes), to win the Mayo Belwa House of Assembly slot.

APC, NNPP clinch Keana, Doma assembly seats in Nasarawa

In Nasarawa, the candidate of the ruling APC, Mohammed Omadefu, was declared as the winner of Keana Constituency for the Nasarawa State $House \, of \, Assembly \, re\text{-run election}.$

Declaring the result in Keana, the Returning Officer for the Constituency, Dr. Hassan Imam of the Federal University of Lafia, said the APC candidate polled 8,069 votes to defeat Basil Osheka of PDP, who scored 7, 917. votes.

Bauchi Ex-speaker wins re-run election

Former Speaker of the Bauchi State House of Assembly, Abubakar Suleiman, of the PDP, has been declared the winner of the re-run election for Ningi constituency in the Bauchi State House of Assembly.

Suleiman of the PDP polled 11,785 votes to defeat his closest opponent, APC's Khalid Captain Ningi.

YPP wins Reps, state Assembly seats in A-Ibom

Candidate of the YPP, Emmanuel Ukpong-Udo, has been declared winner of the Ikono-Ini Federal Constituency re-run election.

Ukpong-Údo is returning to the House of Representatives for a second term, having been first elected into the House on the platform of the PDP

The YPP candidate polled total 24,050 votes to beat closest challenger and candidate of the PDP, Dr Glory Edet, who got 17,232 votes.

Similarly, Godwin Ayi, Collation Officer, announced Moses Easien, also candidate of YPP, as winner of the Ibiono Ibom State constituency re-run

APC's Tafoki wins tight race for Kankara/Faskari/Šabuwa Federal constituency in Katsina In a closely contested race, Mr.

Shehu Dalhatu Tafoki of the APC emerged victorious in the Kankara/ Faskari/Sabuwa Federal constituency of Katsina State,

The INEC declared Tafoki as the winner with a narrow margin of 740 votes. The APC candidate got 49,807 votes, edging out Jamilu Lion of the PDP, who garnered 49,067 votes.

Laguda winner in Surulere I bye election

In Lagos, Faud Laguda, won the Federal Surulere I Constituency bye-

Declaring the results, the Returning Officer for the bye-election, Prof.Simeon Adebayo, announced that the APC candidate polled 11, 203 votes to beat 10 other opponents, who collectively scored less than 800 votes.

Laguda, a former APC chairman in Surulere Local Government Area will now replace former Speaker Femi Gbajabiamila, who has been appointed Chief of Staff to President Bola Tinubu.

Ehindero of APC wins Ondo Reps Bye-Election

In Ondo, lfe Ehindero of the APC, also won the bye-election for Akoko North-East/Akoko North-West Federal Constituency.

The APC candidate was declared winner of the byeelection having scored 35,504 votes to defeat the PDP candidate, Olalekan Bada, who scored 15.324 votes.

APC wins Benue Assembly bve-election

The candidate of the APC, Mr. Terwase Uche, was returned as winner of the Guma 1 State Constituency bye election in Benue State.

Mr. Uche was declared winner of the poll by the Returning Officer of the election, Prof. Julius Ikya in Daudu, after garnering 5,289 votes to defeat his closest rival, Jimmy Geoffrey of the PDP, who polled 4,134

The Labour Party, LP, candidate scored 2,833 votes.

APC candidate wins Oyo re-

In Oyo, APC's Mr Shittu Ibrahim won the Saki West House of Assembly re-run.

 $The\,Returning\,Officer\,for\,Saki\,West$ state constituency, Prof. Olusola Oyewo announced that Ibrahim secured 13,850 votes to beat his closest opponent, Mr Julius Okedoyin, of the PDP, who got 13,670

Ibrahim was returned as winner of the March 18, 2023 election but the court ordered a re-run on account irregularities and cancellation of results from Ward 6 Unit 7 and Ward 11 Unit 19 of the constituency.

Waikumo of APGA wins Yenagoa Constituency II

In Bayelsa, the INEC declared Hon Amakoromo Waikumo of APGA as winner of the Yenagoa Constituency II re-run election. He polled 5959 votes to beat his

closest rival, Mrs Ebiuwou Koku-Obiyai of the PDP, who scored 5263

It would be recalled that before the ordered rerun in seven units of the constituency by the Court of Appeal, the APGA candidate had 4,971 votes while PDP got 4593 during the March last year State House of Assembly election.

The votes scored by the candidates at the just concluded rerun poll were added to what they scored during last year election with the APGA again emerging victorious and truncated the third term ambition of Mrs Koku-Obiyai in the state assembly.



"However, we notice that the former Vice-President, just like in his political contests, is also doing a poor job of it, offering pedestrian and uninformed interventions on our economy and other matters of public concerns.

'Ātiku's latest diatribe was another uncharitable commentary on the state of the economy and the efforts of the President Bola Tinubu administration in remoulding it for sustained

Man beheads lover in Bayelsa

/ENAGOA-Tragedy **Y** struck iat the weekend in the riverside town of Kabeama in Sagbama Local Government of Bayelsa State, when a young man, simply identified as Tony, beheaded his girlfriend.

Though the details of the tragic incident were still sketchy as at the time of filing this report, the deceased lady, a mother of one, was identified as, Miss Maxuel Ebibraladei, an indigene of Amatolo in Southern Ijaw Council Area of the state.

She was allegedly killed by her lover between 2am -3am on Saturday as her headless naked body was discovered at dawn by neighbours.

The boyfriend and father of her child was reportedly apprehended before they could escape by the community folks and handed over to the police.

The remains of the deceased have been deposited at the morque of the Federal Medical Centre, Yenagoa while the suspect is being detained at the State CID.

A community source told Vanguard, "the suspect was apprehended by residents of Kabeama and handed over to the police to avert possible reprisal attack from the kinsmen of the deceased woman

"The source who spoke anonymously however added: "we don't really know what happened between the two lovers that would make him cut off the head of his girl friend and mother of his child.

"They two of them are the quiet and easy going type. We are at a loss what went wrong. The headless corpse of the lady was evacuated and deposited at the mortuary of Federal Medical Centre, Yenagoa on Saturday while the arrested boyfriend is in custody of the police in Yenagoa.

Attempts to reach the spokesman of the state police command proved abortive but a security operative confirmed the tragic incident.

Leave Tinubu alone, North-West youths tell Katsina Elders Forum

S OKOTO — A group, under the aegis of Northwest Youths Progressives Forum, has faulted the position of Katsina State Elders Forum for speaking against the policies of President Bola Tinubu's government.

Recall that the Forum had caution the President to reverse the policies or risk their support in 2027.

Tunji, also disclosed that Adelabu, at the weekend met with top management teams of power Generating companies (GENCOs) Distribution companies (DISCOs) in a bid to find lasting solution to blackout in some parts of the country said, "The meeting also discussed issues of indebtedness GENCOs by Nigeria Bulk Electricity Trading Company (NBET).

"We are aware that the sector has liquidity challenge, but we need to have a minimum threshold, we are working on revalidating the debt and determining a fair resolution.

Adelabu spoke further on the need by GENCOs to enter a

contractual arrangement with gas suppliers to ensure steady supply of gas to generating companies. "We know that there are certain concessions expected of government before this could be achieved and we are willing to work on this to stabilize the power sector, he assured.

To resolve the gas impasse and liquidity issue, the Minister assured that a committee would be set up comprising all stakeholders to come up appropriate recommendations.

"To tackle the gas supply and liquidity challenges, I've decided to form a committee involving stakeholders. Together, we will work on recommendations to resolve these issues and ensure a more reliable and consistent power supply for our citizens.

A plan has also been established to initiate discussions with the Minister of State for Petroleum Resources regarding collaboration and to emphasize to the Ministry the importance of prioritizing Gas to Power.

"Our commitment is unwavering addressing challenges affecting power supply. We understand the impact on citizens, and our goal is to swiftly resolve the issues of gas supply, indebtedness, overall sector stability. Your patience is appreciated as we work collaboratively towards a brighter, more reliable energy future for Nigeria".

Obasanjo, Saraki want smoother trade ties between Nigeria. Angola the two biggest oil exporters

m AGOS-FORMER}$ Obasanjo has called for increased bilateral relations between Nigeria and Angola.

Obasanjo, who was a special guest of honour at the Angola-Nigeria Diplomatic-Business Investment, organised by the Angola-Nigeria Business Council, weekend, said there is a need to boost the trade volume within Africa, which reflects a commitment to economic advancing partnerships on the continent.

The former President advised that attention should be on African countries' benefits from their own products, as it aligns with the goal of promoting intra-African trade and economic self-sufficiency

He expressed concerns about infrastructural deficits, particularly in transportation, highlighted the challenges that needed to be addressed to facilitate seamless trade between nations.

"One of the things the leaders of the post-independence achieved is to promote the African Continental Free Trade Agreement, AfCFTA," he said.

Also, the Secretary of the National Action Committee of AfCFTA, Nigeria, Olusegun Awolowo, said the lack of Foreign Direct Investment, FDI, between Nigeria and Angola underscored the untapped potential for economic engagement between the two largest oil

exporters in Africa.
"This means trade between

is zero, and this is not good enough.

"Angola is importing from the rest of the world what it can actually get from Nigeria, and Nigeria is doing likewise. We should trade between ourselves. Comparatively, we supply what they don't have and they also supply what we don't have.

Obasanjo added that "it's true we have some infrastructural deficits, but both government and the private organisations can also latch on it to invest," he said.

Speaking on the efforts to address trade barriers and streamline visa processes, the President of the Angola-Nigeria Business Council, Fifi Ejindu, called for a positive step towards fostering smoother trade ties between Nigeria and Angola.

According to her, the support from Angolan government authorities further reinforces the potential for progress in this regard.

Princess Ejindu said that the engagement of Nigerian investors and the anticipated business activations in Angola indicated growing interest and participation in the trade initiatives discussed.

Armando Manuel, a former Minister of Finance in Angola, said that a positive assessment of the recent diplomatic-business investment meeting signalled the fruitful nature of the discussions and the potential for tangible outcomes in the near future.







That lifeline allowed Cote d'Ivoire to stun defending champions Senegal and overcome 10-man Mali after extra time to set up a semi-final with DR Congo.

Dominican Republic 2024: Formidable Flamingos rout Central African Republic 6-0 in Douala

Nigeria's U17 girls, Flamingos have set off on another FIFA World Cup journey with a strong warning to opponents, as they dismissed their counterparts from Central African Republic 6-0 in an African second round, first leg qualification game in Douala, Cameroon on Sunday.



They qualified for the World Cup


after defeating their counterparts from Burundi by a lone goal in the second leg of their FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup final qualifying round fixture.
